

FAIR MEDALS FOR THE NORTHWEST

Grand Prize for Iowa's Educational Exhibit—Honors for North Dakota.

Special to The Journal. World's Fair, St. Louis, Oct. 18.—The international jury of awards gave Iowa's educational exhibit as a whole one grand prize and different classes of work received eight gold medals.

The mining exhibit of North Dakota, representing the state's undeveloped mineral resources, was awarded one gold medal for the entire display.

One of the grand prizes to Minnesota was awarded Professor W. M. Hayes of the school of agriculture.

The Minnesota butter display in the large refrigerator, consisting of the butter monument representing the discovery of St. Anthony Falls by Father Hennepin, received a gold medal.

A silver medal was awarded the cheese exhibit, and also to the exhibit of bees in the area made by Mrs. Francis Herd of Winona.

The Pillsbury-Washburn company, which has a fine exhibit of its own, occupying a large section in the agricultural building, received a gold medal.

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INDIANS REBELL, DECLARES SCOTT

Leech Lake Agent Says State Has No Right to So-called Swamp Lands.

From The Journal Bureau, Colorado Building, Washington, Oct. 18.—Major Scott, agent at Leech Lake, uses strong language in commenting on the state's selection of swamp lands in ceded Indian reservations in his annual report to the commissioner of Indian affairs.

"A claim was made by the state and allowed by the department, of swamp lands within ceded Indian territory in the state," he says.

"In behalf of the Indians, I protest against what I believe to be an unlawful and unjust disposition of their property and the matter is now being carefully investigated by the land department and patents will not be issued until the matter is adjusted."

Major Scott says the unlawful sale of open water and swamp lands to Indians for lands included in the Minnesota forest reserve, a renewal of last year's recommendation.
