HAYNES TO WAIT OFFICIAL COUNT

PROSPECTIVE CONTEST DEPENDS ON THE FINAL FIGURES.

He Says He'll Take His Time in Reaching a Decision—His Managers, However, Are More Insistent for a Re-count—Irregularities Will Be Urged for Haynes' Benefit.

There is still uncertainty as to whether Mayor Haynes will contest the election of D. P. Jones and demand a re-count.

George P. Douglas, the mayor's secretary, is more pronounced in his opinion. He says he is "certainly" that there should be a recount from reports that are getting of careless work in certain precincts.

The probability is that we shall ask for a recount, he says. "In such a close election I think that both republicans and democrats would be better satisfied if there were absolute accuracy."

L. H. Cornell, the democratic election judge in the twelfth precinct of the eighth ward, who allowed a republican to take his place, was seen by The Journal today and said emphatically: "I believe Mr. Douglas is mistaken in thinking that there was a miscarriage of justice in the election."

CANNOT CATCH WINDOW-SMASHER

JOHNSON HOLDS HIS LEAD WELL INTO MAN'S SIDE

Latest Returns Do Not Make Material Change in Yesterday's Footings on Governor.

Complete returns have been received by The Journal from fifty-six counties outside of Hennepin and Ramsey, and with the remaining twenty-five counties closely estimated.

Today county complete, gives Roosevelt 2,910; Parker, 720; Dunn, 2,033; Johnson, 1,859.

Traverse gives Roosevelt 885; Parker, 247; Dunn, 607; Johnson, 586.

Wadena county gives Roosevelt 1,156; Parker, 190; Dunn, 740; Johnson, 630.

St. Louis county complete, gives Roosevelt 1,344; Parker, 226; Dunn, 1,041; Johnson, 656.

Douglas county complete gives Roosevelt 2,186; Parker 499; Dunn 1,299; Johnson, 1,440.

The grand earnings tax measure has been carried by from 60 to 30 per cent of the total vote, but in some counties reported the grand jury amendment fails of a majority.

The state returns will be opened by the state of the board, at the same time, Dec. 20. The first return was received this morning, from Traverse county.

Each county is required to send its returns to the secretary of state, one can be opened before the official canvass.
