KAISER'S GIFT OF STATUE UNVEILED

President Accepts Figure of Frederick the Great for America.

Washington, Nov. 19.—Hailed by a military band of twenty trumpets, the bronze statue of Frederick the Great, presented to the American people by Emperor William, was unveiled this afternoon by the Baroness Speck von Sternberg, the wife of the German ambassador. The ceremony was marked by great military and official display.

The president made the chief address of the day, and accepted the gift on behalf of the American people. 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THE CHURCHES. CHURCH'S NEW CHAPEL OPENED

IMPROVEMENTS AT PARK AVENUE CONGREGATIONAL.

The new chapel of Park Avenue Congregational church was thrown open for inspection at the annual holiday and given by the Ladies' Social and Benevolent union. The church yesterday afternoon. Work on the addition is practically completed and Sunday school will be held in the new quarters.

FRESHMEN UTILIZED AS SANDWICH MEN

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The remodeled and enlarged chapel has had an addition of 40x50 and, with the basement and gallery, far more than doubles the working capacity of the building. The old and new chapel are thrown into one room for the use of the Sunday school and other large gatherings, but sliding doors in the middle permit it to be divided when smaller rooms are needed.

On the main floor, near the main entrance, are two large and attractive parlors, separated from each other and the large room by sliding doors. One of these rooms has a handsome fireplace and in the other is a large locker.

The women of the church have been among the hardest workers to secure the new chapel, with its improvements, for they were very much needed in carrying on the social work of the church. The kitchen was planned in accordance with their ideas and wishes and it is believed it is as complete and convenient as any church kitchen in the city.

The large room has three sides lined with cupboards and chest of drawers, in which there is place for all kinds of crockery, cut glass and china. A large sink, whose copper lining extends up the wall behind it, affords a bit of glowing color as well as fulfills its utilitarian purpose. A very complete hot-water system, consisting of a small three-burner stove constitute the equipment for cooking. In addition there is a special coffee boiler and a hot-water heater.

The extensive additions and improvements will cost, when completed, about \$17,000, and the funds for the work were practically all paid before the building was begun. The building operations have been directed by a special committee of which S. H. Towler is chairman.
