SOCIETY WOMAN A BOOKBINDER

Mrs. Hobart Chatfield Taylor Is True to Her Belief That Every Woman of Leisure Should Have Definite Work to Broaden Her Life and Opens the Rose Bindery in Chicago.

Chicago, Dec. 21.—"The Rose Bindery," Mrs. Hobart C. Chatfield-Taylor, proprietor, will do his best to rouse general interest in the beautiful and substantial binding of books. The society leader, who has gone into the business for the purpose of filling up her spare time with useful labor, has no doubt of success.

Mrs. Chatfield-Taylor is an advocate of the view that every man and woman in the world should learn to do useful things with their hands. When asked whether there were not other reasons for her entering business, besides the desire to succeed financially, she replied frankly that there were.

Mrs. Chatfield-Taylor became interested in bookbinding several years ago, and spent some months in the studio of a friend.

"I was so fascinated with it," she says, "that I determined the next time I went to Paris to learn everything I could about the craft. Having done that, I am back home at work.

"Bookbinding is an art. Not a great art like painting or writing, which call for original thought at all times. It is more a matter of fine workmanship, artistically carried out.

"My bindings are to be entirely in levant and morocco. These leathers are durable, while vellum is not. I laid in a large stock of skins in Paris, and, as you see, they are very beautiful."

"Will you exercise any choice in the subject matter of the books you bind?"

"None whatever. I will bind any book that comes along. It is a matter of business with me, that's all, and if people have books that they want put into enduring covers and are willing to pay for the work I am here to do it."

This initial work has been ordered by President Loubet of France, whom the Chatfield-Taylor met while in Paris.

In case the Russell poems are delayed, Mrs. Chatfield-Taylor and Miss Mildred George, her partner, will give attention to a costly edition of "Paradise Lost" from the Doves Press. This book, owned by Alfred Granger, typographically is a masterpiece. Another book which is awaiting a binding is owned by Bourke Cockran of New York. Mrs. Chatfield-Taylor already has sufficient orders to keep the bindery in motion until Easter.



NURSES OPEN WAR ON WHITE PLAGUE

Warnings and Suggestions Issued, with Offer of Free Care for Needy.

New York Sun Special Service.

Chicago, Dec. 22.—War on tuberculosis is being waged in earnest by the Visiting Nurses' association of Chicago, which has issued a circular giving warnings and suggestions regarding the disease and offering free treatment and nursing in all cases where victims are unable to pay.

The association has appealed to all civic societies, lodges and labor organizations to cooperate with it in the war on consumption, and officials for the organization believe that great good can be accomplished if directions to the public are seriously regarded.

The Visiting Nurses' association has a special committee in charge of the work to prevent tuberculosis in Chicago, and this committee, with headquarters at 79 Dearborn street, has issued the circular now being distributed to the public.

In this circular the association makes the following offer:

For those unable to pay the tuber-

culosis committee will arrange for medical treatment and nursing care at their homes. Write to tuberculosis committee.

In addition to this offer the association is circulating through Chicago the following suggestions to everybody for the purpose of preventing consumption:

"Don't live in rooms where there is no fresh air.

"Don't work in rooms where there is no fresh air.

"Don't spit on sidewalks—it spreads disease and is against the law.

"Don't spit on floors of your room, office or workshop.

"Don't sleep in rooms where there is no fresh air.

"Keep at least one window open in your bedroom at night, as fresh air helps to kill the consumption germs.

"Don't neglect a cold or a cough, and never eat with soiled hands—always wash hands in hot water before eating."

Advice on Cure.

In addition to these suggestions, the association is circulating advice on how to cure consumption. Among other things, people who wish to cure consumption are advised not to waste money on patent medicines, not to drink whisky, beer or other intoxicating drinks, not to sleep with other people or in a room with other persons, to live in the sunshine as much as possible, keeping windows of livingrooms open night and day, winter and summer, and to go to a hospital where all the beneficial precautions will be taken when-

NEW YORK LEADS IN CONCENTRATED WEALTH

New York, Dec. 22.—Twenty-five million dollars of value in each of several blocks of buildings and their contents, aside from the land, puts New York atop of American cities in the matter of concentration of wealth. This is shown by tables published in the insurance press to show how great is the danger of destruction by fire of the savings of society.

Many blocks in New York city contain \$10,000,000 worth of property. Chicago, Philadelphia and Newark, N. J., each has a single block containing property valued at \$8,000,000. Boston's most valuable block is worth \$7,000,000. San Francisco's \$6,000,000 and Pittsburgh's \$5,000,000.
