## FINAL FIGURES ON MINNESOTA'S YOTE

CITY NEWS

ROOSEVELT CARRIED THE STATE BY 161,464 PLURALITY.

Of the Minnesota Congressmen, Andrew J. Volstead, Republican, in the Seventh District, Led All the Rest with a Vote of 27,060 to 341 for His Rival.

Minnesota's presidential vote: Roosevelt (rep.), 216,651. Parker (dem.), 55,187. Watson (pop.), 2,103. Swallow (pro.), 6,253. Debs (pub.-own.), 11,692. Corregan (soc.-lab.), 974. Roosevelt's plurality, 161,464. Roosevelt's majority, 140,442. Total vote for president, 292,860. Total vote 1900, 316,311.

The official canvass of Minnesota' vote on president shows a larger Roose-velt plurality than at first figured. velt plurality than at first figured. While the total vote was about 23,000 less than four years ago, Roosevelt received over 26,000 votes more than Mc-Kinley, and Parker about 57,000 less than Bryan, the Parker vote being less than half that east for Bryan.

Roosevelt received over 73 per cent of the total vote, while four years ago McKinley received just 60 per cent. The congressional vote by districts has been canvassed by the state canvassing board. It stands as follows:

Official Vote on Governor. John A. Johnson's official plurality over R. C. Dunn is 7,862. The official footings were made this afternoon by the state canvassing board. They give Dunn 140,130 votes and Johnson 147, 992. Footings on the other state officers were not finished until a late hour.

### WON'T SHORTEN

SCHOOL PRINCIPAL WHO DOESN'T LIKE OILED FLOORS DECLINES PROSPECTIVE ADVICE.

Oiled floors are gaining in favor among the public school tes principals. At the opening of the present school year, only four principals out of the sixty in the city were willing to approve the system of oiling floors and now more than one-half are converts to

now more than one-half are converts to the oil idea.
W. H. Adams, superintendent of buildings, has recently obtained the opinions of nearly all the principals, and finds that at least thirty of them are in favor of oiling as a measure of cleanliness. It seems to be generally conceded that the oil catches and retains the dust of the schoolroom, and that the air is cleaner on that account, and this consideration is a paramount one in the opinion of most of the principals who favor it.

favor it. About twenty-eight principals appear About twenty-eight principals appear more or less opposed to the use of oil, but of these, twelve or thirteen favor the use of oil on the hallways and stairs, but not in the schoolrooms, leaving only about fifteen who object to having it anywhere.

The big objection and the only one raised in a majority of the schools is that the oil on the floors is taken up by the dress skirts, ruining the garments

that the oil on the floors is taken up by the dress skirts, ruining the garments. The answer to this objection in Boston was that the teachers should wear short skirts and anticipating such advice here, one principal rather defiantly announces. "My skirts are as short as I can wear them—three inches from the floor." One principal complains about injury to her shoes, another that the oiled floors are slippery, another that the oil smells badly and must hence be unsanitary. Several say that the oiled floors seem black and dirty, and urge good old-fashioned scrubbing once a week.


