TALBOT SCANDAL INQUIRY CERTAIN

Prosecution of the Pennsylvania Bishop in Church Court Bound to Take Place.

New York Sun Special Service. New York, Dec. 29.—Despite the stories from Philadelphia to the effect that the inquiry has been improperly called and may not take place at all...

Herbert Noble, the New York lawyer and prominent churchman, has been retained by the wealthy and influential men behind the presentment to direct the prosecution of the bishop.

Presentment churchmen thruout the United States are urging that if the Talbot scandal must be dragged into the light the famous Upjohn letter of itself should mark the limit of disclosures.

All dread that phase of the remarkable case in which the central figure is Mrs. Emma D. Elliott, the accomplished and brilliant woman who is said to have wounded the haughty bishop of central Pennsylvania around her slender finger.

Demand Public Hearing. Whether the inquiry at Reading shall be secret or public is a matter not yet wholly determined.

Bishop Talbot has met the startling accusations brought against him with absolute composure. Almost equally silent are the four prominent ministers and laymen who are definitely known to espouse his cause.

Support for Upjohn Letter. The presentment copy of this letter will be attested under oath by Rev. Dr. J. Andrew Harris of Chestnut Hill, one of the most distinguished men in the Episcopal church.

Surprising developments in this case are predicted by those best informed. It is asserted by a Philadelphia churchman of high authority that the powerful influences behind the presentment will not consent to the suppressing of any evidence in their possession.

WOMAN IN CASE TAKES Mrs. Elliott Defends Bishop and Assails Unfrolicked Priest.

Huntington, Pa., Dec. 29.—Mrs. Emma D. Elliott, who is one of the central figures in the church scandal involving Bishop Talbot and the unfrocked minister, Ingram N. D. Irvine, discussed the issues today for the first time since the case has been reopened.

I have hesitated to reply to these base, false and cruel insinuations that have been leveled against me by the man whom I befriended, broke bread at my table and who took money from my hand.

When Dr. Irvine came here, I told him in the presence of two other women members of our church that I was a divorced woman. He made no objection to my becoming a communicant.

Now what do you think of Rev. Dr. Irvine? That is the explanation of the whole controversy. Of course, with Bishop Talbot I learned the truth about Dr. Irvine to talk about it, and later took my side in the matter.

IRVINE DEFENDS COURSE Plaintiff in Prosecution of Bishop Talbot Talks.

Philadelphia, Dec. 29.—"Can a bishop or ought a bishop write defamatory letters in secret in order to injure any member of the ministry? This is the question which will be decided at the meeting of the board of inquiry in the case of Irvine vs. Talbot."

"My resentment," continued Dr. Irvine, "is a secondary consideration when contrasted with the above query. Of course, I wish to have this unjust deposition removed, but I wish also entirely without malice to be vindicated in the sight of God and my friends."

Dismissing the motive of the presentment, Dr. Irvine said that it was because he had persistently refused to serve communion to Mrs. Emma D. Elliott of Huntington, Pa., who is divorced, against the wishes of Bishop Talbot.

Bishop Talbot and I, along with about 1,600 other members of the ministry, said Dr. Irvine signed the declaration which was sent to all the bishops and clergy in the United States and presented to the general convention of 1898, and which prayed for more stringent restrictions in


