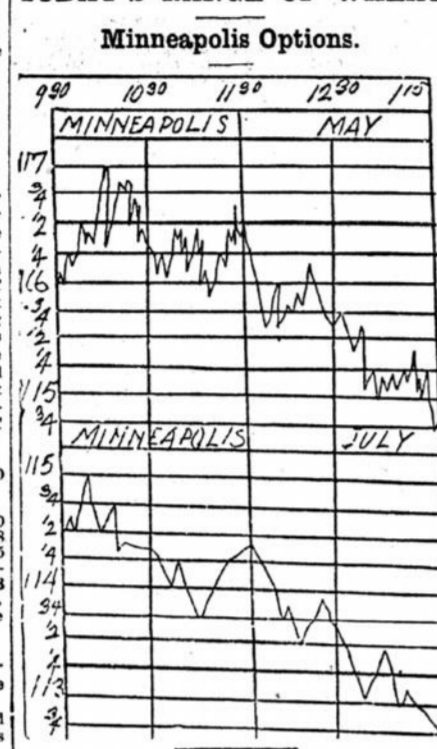

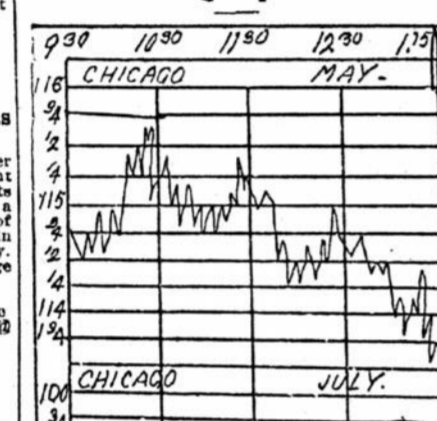
TODAY'S RANGE OF WHEAT
