FEAR OF CATASTROPHE ON BROOKLYN BRIDGE

New York Sun Special Service. New York, Jan. 13.—Fearful lest the strain to which the Brooklyn bridge is being subjected will weaken it to such an extent that a great catastrophe will result, engineers of the department of bridges have determined that the structure must be almost completely

rebuilt. To do this will require at least two years, and meanwhile traffic between New York and Brooklyn will have to be diverted to the Williamsport bridge, the new Manhattan bridge now in course of construction, and to the Brooklyn subway tunnel. But little will remain of the present Brooklyn bridge except the great stone piers, which are practically impishable. It is estimated that the cost of rebuilding the bridge will be about five million dollars. Aside from the real danger of using

the bridge for any considerable time to come, the structure is now far from being equal to the demands that are being made upon it.
