MICHIGAN

BIG NEW LOCK NEEDED AT SOO

MICHIGAN SHIP CANAL MUST FIRST BE WIDENED.

This Alone Will Cost a Million—Contracts Now Made Will Require Expenditures of Four Millions and a Half—Era of Big Boats Makes a New Lock Imperative.

Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Jan. 10.—Owing to the increasing number of large freighters and the prospect of many more coming into commission during the next few years, it is considered that the present locks of the Michigan ship canal are inadequate to handle the traffic. A new lock will be needed at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., and it will take several years to complete it.

In order to build the proposed lock it will be necessary to widen the Michigan ship canal above the present locks at an expense of more than \$1,000,000. The estimate for this work will require at least two years of steady labor.

At present boats passing through the Soo locks make several turns, but the improvements contemplated will do away with this feature. In doing so millions of yards of dirt will have to be removed and the government must construct a great park in the heart of the city sacrificed. The lock will have a width of seventy-five feet and will be adapted to the handling of the big boats which are to control all the traffic on the upper lakes in years to come.

This year twenty new ones will be launched. The launching of the big steamer Augustus B. Wolvin last year was a great event in lake navigation circles.

None of the big boats can be locked thru the Weitzel lock with a load, and the Wolvin and a few other big ones are so long that this lock will not hold them. Many others that will go thru the Weitzel lock when running light will not be able to carry a cargo, as they will draw so much water that they bump on the sills. This lock is all right for the lumber carriers, but something better is needed at this time to handle the traffic that will demand locks in ten years or more.

FIFTEEN IN DES MOINES STAND TO LOSE \$20,000.
