RUSSIAN TROOPS WILL FIGHT CZAR

FORMER CAPTAIN SAYS THEIR LOYALTY IS DOUBTFUL.

Present Disturbances Cap the Climax in a Series of Events Which Are Forcing Home Upon the People the Fact That the Czar's Autocracy Can Not Last.

Alexis Georgian, formerly a captain in the famous Caucasus rough riding regiment under the Russian government, now an exile from his mountain home, Tiflis, on account of his political views, visited George B. Leonard today. Alexis Georgian has been under suspicion by the Russian government since 1898, when he came to the United States, he has visited the different provinces of Russia several times since then. Originally educated as a priest, Captain Georgian proved of too adventurous a nature to submit to the narrow life of the cloister. During his life as a soldier he served in almost every corner of the empire. He became so famous as a rough rider that he was offered a large salary to travel with a circus and show in America and being suspected of liberal tendencies he gladly accepted the offer.

"SCOURGE OF MANKIND"

DR. WELCH TELLS OF PREVALENCE OF TUBERCULOSIS.

"Prevention is Better Than Cure and Far Cheaper"—John Locke.—Consumption Is Not Inherited—It Does Not Belong to Our Climate—It Is Very Often Cured.

Baltimore, Md.—Dr. William H. Welch's words made a deep impression. Said Dr. Welch: "The warfare against tuberculosis is now worldwide. The question might be asked, Why should this disease be singled out for attack? What is there about tuberculosis more than diphtheria or scarlet fever or typhoid fever or some other fatal disease that it, and not they, should be centered upon for attack? "The idea that tuberculosis is a curable ailment is a modern one. It was until the bacillus, or germ, was discovered in 1882 that the origin of the disease was really known and definite ideas as to its growth and how it should be treated were finally formed. It is always the result of the reception of a parasite into its host's body and the germ, which is the cause of the disease, comes from another human body. This knowledge at once made clear to the public that the time had come to start such a movement as it is here proposed for the purpose of training the people to the points of attack are tolerably clear. It is self-evident that everything should be done to guard against the spread of the bacillus from human sources. Emphasis is then laid upon preventing the escape of the germ from humans. We know that the organism cannot grow outside of the human body, for while animals are susceptible to tuberculosis, it is only to a slight extent that the germs survive for a year or two in dark, damp corners, but we know that when exposed to the sunlight it dies. The danger of infection is almost entirely from dwellings, hotels, theaters, vehicles and the like, but the danger is not from the open air, or from the dust in the streets. "Scarcely any one of adult age escapes from the bacillus, and the bacteria leaves its record behind it. In a majority of cases, however, this does not mean consumption, as most of us have the powers of resistance sufficient to throw off the germ. If the resistance of human bodies could be increased, the bacteria could sink and be harmless. Some persons think that it is better to attack the disease from this standpoint. It seems to me, however, that the rational plan is to attack the enemy in both ways, and to wage war against the germ itself, as well as endeavor to train the human body to resist it.
