GOVERNMENT MEN PROBE A TRUST

Inspectors Are in Iowa for Evidence and Will Come to Minnesota.

Special to The Journal. Des Moines, Iowa, March 9.—Three government inspectors are in the city to probe the operations of the beef trust in Iowa.

It is understood that the inspectors will go from Des Moines to Sioux City, Kansas City and South St. Paul before returning to Washington with a report.

Des Moines is the heart of the fight between the packing trust and cattle shippers. At a recent meeting of the Corn Belt Meat Producers' association in this city it was asserted that Iowa interests had been greatly damaged by trust rates on cars, by trust discrimination against small dealers in cattle, and by various other methods.
