BURDICK DIES FALSE TO TRUST

LATE TREASURER OF A MONTANA COUNTY FOUND DEAD. Shortage in His Accounts of About \$3,000 Leads to the Belief that He Committed Suicide Rather Than Face His Shame—Boulder Man's Mysterious Death in a Butte Block.

Special to the Journal. Butte, Mont., March 14.—E. W. Burdick of Butte, late treasurer of Jefferson county, was found dead in a room in the Beaver block last night.

A report from Boulder today gave the information that Mr. Burdick was short in his accounts with the county somewhere between \$2,500 and \$3,000, and this is believed to have prompted him to take his life.

Burdick came to Butte from Boulder on Friday and engaged a room in the Beaver block. It was supposed that he was here on business, but from the time he came to the city until his death body was found on the bed in the room he was seen but a few times.
