


NEW OWATONNA CHURCH WITH NOVEL FEATURES

The First Universalist church, Owatonna, Minn., is a structure that will seat altogether in the church and chapel, which may be thrown together, about 2000. The distinction which characterizes the structure is—first, the employment of the Spanish-Mission type of architecture, which is new to this section, and second the construction, which consists of a wooden frame, covered with expanded steel metal and finished with Portland cement, giving the appearance of a masonry structure.

COSTLY CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OPENED AT YANKTON, SO. DAKOTA

Yankton, S. D., March 21.—The new Congregational church was formally opened on Sunday. Rev. Dan F. Bradley, president of Grinnell college, Iowa, delivered the address at both the morning and evening services. The capacity of the church was tested at the morning service, when every seat and 100 chairs were taken. Rev. Mr. Bradley demonstrated his financial ability by securing pledges from the congregation amounting to \$2,000. The building committee was behind \$2,377, and when the evening service was closed the entire amount had been pledged. The total cost of the church is \$27,329, and it is by far the most beautiful church in the city and is excelled by none in the state.
