

# CITY NEWS TO TAKE LID OFF THE STATE FAIR

## BILLS PENDING WHICH WOULD MAKE IT "WIDE OPEN."

A Certain St. Paul Clique Constructs Well-Veiled Measures for the Legislature, One Effect of Which Would Be to Permit Illegal Liquor-Selling on or Near the Grounds.

What appears to be a well-organized attack upon the Minnesota state fair by interests which want to see the fair run on the wide-open principle, has developed in the legislature. The element which had a good deal to say in state-fair matters some twelve or fifteen years ago, when blind pigs flourished and when pool-selling governed the racetrack, to the scandal of the mass of the people of the state, is doing its best to regain a place on the fair grounds. The movement originates in St. Paul, but among a crowd which the better class of St. Paul business men frown upon and oppose vigorously.

The first appearance of the campaign against the fair was in the shape of a harmless-looking bill removing from justices of the peace jurisdiction in cases of offense against the liquor laws. This was to apply in "counties of 75,000 population or over," and was introduced by a Duluth member of the legislature. The state-fair law provides for holding a justice court on the fair grounds during fair week, and gives this court jurisdiction for half a mile outside the grounds, thus completely covering the blind-pig situation in connection with the fair. Under the present state-fair management has been able to hold the blindpiggers in check and remove what was once a stain on the state-fair record.

As soon as the effect of this bill was discovered, a friend of the state fair in the house secured an amendment exempting the fair from its provisions. The measure was at once dropped and another was immediately introduced in the senate. It is now pending. "Hickey bill." Under the present state-fair law, representation in the Minnesota State Agricultural society is thru appointment by county agricultural societies. The Hickey bill provides that when a county agricultural society does not appoint, the governor shall appoint members from such county. As there
