INFANT VICTIM OF A 'BABY FARM'

IT PERSISTED IN LIVING AND WAS ABANDONED.

Iniquitous Business Revealed When Charity Organizations Were Asked to Care for the Tot—Probate Court Judge Places It in the State School at Owatonna.

With its blue eyes standing wide open in wonder, a very pretty and very small baby was brought before Judge Harvey of the probate court this morning by the humane society and the Associated Charities.

It has been impossible either for the police or the agents of the charitable societies to detect any of the participants in the iniquitous business until a visitor of the Humane society and a visiting nurse of the Associated Charities were called in by a woman who had been paid to take a child from one of the private "hospitals."

As it is illegal to transfer a child from a parent to another person without registering at the probate court, the matter was taken up legally.
