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

The ten Royal Arcanum councils of Minneapolis will hold a union meeting and class initiation at Masonic Temple, Tuesday evening, April 18, in honor of Supreme Regent A. S. Robinson of St. Louis, Mo. A specially selected degree team will exemplify the mysteries with impressive ceremonial and elaborate musical features. The following local councils will participate: Minnehaha, Cataract, Hennepin, Cecilia, Flour City, Minneapolis, Haza, St. Anthony, Gopher and John S. Pillsbury, representing a membership of 3,200, besides visiting delegations from St. Paul and other cities of the state. For the first time in the history of Quaker institutions in this country a woman has been appointed as principal of one of that sect's schools, an office fact that Mrs. John Cox, Jr., wife of a New York architect, has been asked to fill the position of head of the Chappagna Mountain Institute, has greatly interested the staid Quaker folk of the community.

Mrs. Cox, whose home is in the pretty village of Chappagna, just opposite the seminary, is a graduate of Cornell University, having taken her doctor's degree there about six or eight years ago. Her specialty is natural science, although she has taught several other branches. She is one of the trustees of the Friends' Seminary in New York City.

Perched high up in the mountains of Westchester, in the heart of the Quaker town of Chappagna, the seminary stands. For the last thirty years it has taught the Quaker boys and girls of that section of the country. For more than one hundred and fifty years the little Quaker community at that point has existed. There is an old Friends' meeting house just outside the seminary grounds, whose original structure was built about the year 1740.

One of the innovations which Mrs. Cox will introduce in the school is gardening. Girls and boys will grow their own vegetables and care and tend their own plots. Mrs. Cox is looking forward to
