## THE ROCKEFELLER PALACE AGAIN

HIS MAGNIFICENT PLACE ON THE POCAHTICO HILLS.

A Marble Structure With Gardens that Promise to be the Wonders of the World—The Mansion Will Cost a Million—How He Is Buying Up All the land in the Vicinity.

John D. Rockefeller, who has lived as plainly as a farmer on his big estate on Pocahontic hills, near Tarrytown, will soon blossom out in all the splendor of a Roman voluptuary. His plain old frame house, with its pine verandas painted yellow, which crowns an old hilltop, will give place as a homestead to a magnificent palace of marble to be

built on the summit of the Kyuit mountain, overlooking the Hudson in all its grandeur. And, as a fitting compliment to this palace, landscape gardeners have already laid out extensive sunken rose gardens that are the wonders of the horticultural world.

For once in his life John D. Rockefeller, who has been popularly supposed to be of somewhat frugal inclination, has thrown off the limit.

Such doing at Pocahontic hills have never been seen. To begin with, the mansion will cost a cool million—and more, if necessary. There will be nothing else like it in the country—so the intimate friends of Mr. Rockefeller say. From the elevated perch on the mountain the scene presented will be one of splendor. To the north will stretch Sleepy Hollow—famous in legend. Away to the east will loom the blue Connecticut hills, and in the south will sparkle the placid waters of the Sound and the green clad hills of Long Island, while on the west there will be the majestic Hudson, backed by the stately Palisades and the mountains of Jersey.

And then the sunken rose garden! There have been hanging gardens of Babylon, and Roman peristyles with cool fountains in the select confines of

Herculeum. There have been terraces of blooming shrubs in the temples of Egyptian kings. But there will be but one sunken garden and that will be John D. Rockefeller's. As a start, \$50,000 has been allotted for its building. The plans were drawn by John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and comprise three square gardens 300 feet square to be sunk ten feet below the surface of the main driveway leading to the big stone stables. Artistic stone walls will surround the garden. There will be one main entrance which will lead to a stone staircase, by which the visitor will descend to the garden, which will be beautified with the rarest plants and flowers to be found. Already three carloads of lilies, roses and rare shrubs and blooming flowers have been ordered and more will follow. But this is only the beginning of the many wonderful things that are to happen at Pocahontic Hills, and also it is but the beginning of the endeavor to make the estate one of the most magnificent in America.

And what is the cause of it all? A woman.

Why, of course. You might have guessed that yourself.

This woman is the wife of John D. Rockefeller, Jr. She was formerly Miss

Abby Aldrich, daughter of Senator Aldrich of Rhode Island.

Mr. Rockefeller first purchased his country residence and the surrounding grounds of 500 acres in 1894 for \$653,000. To this he added in 1897 \$50,000 worth of land in Sleepy Hollow. Then in April, 1900, he bought 207 acres, comprising the Kingsland farm, for which he paid \$200 an acre. Then thru his real estate agents he acquired nearly all the smaller farms and homesteads as they were offered for sale. At the present time Mr. Rockefeller owns more than 6,000 acres and he has just purchased nearly all the houses and lots in the little village of Briggsville, just west of Pocahontic Hills and adjoining his great domain. There is one man whom he has failed to bring to terms, however, and that is John Melin, the lone tavern keeper of Briggsville, who has refused to sell his place until he gets a good price. But Mr. Rockefeller does not pay fancy prices for land, as some people think, and as a result Melin is still running his little inn, while the multi-millionaire is rapidly buying up all the land around the tavern.

He has already spent about \$5,000,000 in improvements, and instead of tearing down the more humble residences that he purchased, he remodeled them

and made them more artistic and comfortable. In addition he built a fine villa for John D. Rockefeller, Jr., and turned over a fine house to his superintendent, while his gardeners and other employees occupy unusually artistic homes.

Radiating from the main house are miles of wooded driveways, opening on fields and green meadows and vistas of shrubbery and evergreen. Thousands of dollars have been spent in improving the system of drainage and reclaiming the waste lands of the various properties absorbed. A chain of lakes connected with little waterfalls have been laid out in the historical Sleepy Hollow, while now a private \$50,000 reservoir is being constructed on the summit of Raven Rock mountain to supply his great estate with drinking water as well as a high pressure for fire purposes.

One of the features of the estate is an eighteen-hole golf course, which is being placed in superb condition, as Mr. Rockefeller, Jr., will return to Pocahontic, with his wife and several friends, on April 15. One of Mr. Rockefeller's guests will be Dr. Harper of the Chicago university, who, if able, will play golf there for his health.

The site for the mansion has been staked out and is said that work will

be started on it May 1. An oddity of the Rockefeller place is a bird museum. When a wild hawk or bird flies on one of the oil-tank steamers of the Standard Oil trust, it is captured, if possible, and after being killed and stuffed, is sent to the Pocahontic estate. Recently a large bird alighted in the standing rigging of the tank line steamer Excelsior while she was far out at sea. The bird was not only tired out, but it had every evidence of having been engaged in a fierce fight. The crew for a time was puzzled as to what kind of a bird it was, and they did not find out until an ornithologist employed by the Standard Oil company had examined it and decided that the bird was a sea eagle, and a splendid specimen at that. The bird measures, when its wings are spread, from tip to tip, nearly five feet.

Mr. Rockefeller employs a special game warden, who patrols the extensive private parks and keeps away poachers. The park is filled with foxes, squirrels and various other kinds of small wild animals, and the millionaire will allow no one to shoot on his domain. Bird houses and squirrel ranges are constructed all thru the parks, where the birds and little animals make their homes in the winter time.

Until the new palace is built, Mr. and Mrs. Rockefeller will entertain
