STRIKE MENACE IN COURT DICTUM

Blow Dealt Bakers' 10-Hour Law May Move 85,000 Men to Quit Work.

New York, April 18.—The decision of the United States supreme court against the constitutionality of the bakers' ten-hour law will, it is feared, be followed by a strike of 85,000 bakers in the leading cities of the country.

The Supreme Court Opinion. The supreme court of the United States, held to be unconstitutional the New York state law making ten hours a day's work and sixty hours a week's work in bakeries.
