

### VOTE PRICELIST IN NEW YORK LOBBY

Schedule of Niagara Power Grab Figures Is Fixed and Openly Discussed.

New York Sun Special Service. Albany, N. Y., April 18.—Here is the schedule of rates for legislative

favors in the interest of the Leggett Niagara power grab bill. For the legislator engineering the deal on the floor, \$5,000. For his assistants, \$500 apiece for their votes and \$500 apiece additional for getting their friends into line. For the ordinary legislator willing to sell his vote, 500. The frankness with which the promoters of the grab have made known this schedule to the members, is openly commented upon in the corridors and lobby. One of the old-time lobbyists here said: "I've been here a good many years and never saw the game played so openly and aboveboard." Nothing that can be accomplished by the free use of money is being left undone by the backers of the Leggett bill.

Assemblyman Thompson, the author of last year's Niagara grab, but who refused to stand for it this year, says: "The men promoting this legislation are doing everything in their power to put the bill thru and to raise sentiment thru out the state in its favor. I myself am interested in a paper in Lockport and I know that an effort was made to purchase the support of that paper in the interest of the bill. I see that a number of newspapers up the state have just some out advocating its passage, saying that the only way to save the falls is to pass the Leggett bill. It's pure rot. The argument that the Power company advances is that its charter now allows it to take an unlimited quantity of water from Niagara river, while the Leggett bill limits it to a quantity sufficient to generate 400,000 horsepower. Why, 400,000 horsepower is just the same almost as unlimited supply. It is all the company could use. Isn't that going the limit? The idea that the Leggett bill will save the falls is preposterous.

In England, as in the United States, there is difficulty in getting naval constructors, private firms paying the good men more than the government.
