**McINTYRE WINS AT LAST**

**CARRIES MOUNTAIN DISTRICT FOR CONSERVATIVES ON THE ISSUE OF PROVINCIAL EXPANSION.**

Special to The Journal. Winnipeg, Man., April 28.—Manitoba yesterday achieved a signal victory in Mountain district, one fought out distinctly on the rights of the province with special reference to interference by the papal delegate in the extension

of its boundaries. It was not in any sense a party victory, but proved itself a test vote on the stand. Manitobans generally take regarding the proper expansion of their province.

The last returns in ten polling subdivisions give D. A. McIntyre, conservative, 347; J. B. Baird, liberal, 728. In addition to this, one belated subdivision return has come in without giving the figure for both parties, but merely saying, "Glenora polls 34 majority for McIntyre, thus making his majority 146."

The last vote polled in July, 1903, gave Thomas Greenway, liberal, 911; McIntyre, conservative, 567, and Will by the papal delegate in the extension

The district never elected a conservative before.
