PLANS NEW LINE INTO TWIN CITIES

EXTENSION NORTH FROM IOWA FALLS TO GIVE CONNECTION.

Small Iowa Railroad Plans Northward Movement, Completing a Link Between Twin Cities, Des Moines and Kansas City—The Plans Considered Would Make It the Short Line.

Iowa Falls, Iowa, April 28.—President E. S. Ellsworth, who recently returned from the south, has outlined the plans of the Des Moines, Iowa Falls & Northern relative to its extension northeast from this city. The route this extension will take and its objective point has been a subject of much speculation, and Mr. Ellsworth's statements are naturally of much interest throughout northern and northeastern Iowa.

Mr. Ellsworth said, in substance, that it had long been the company's desire to build north from here, its present northern terminus, in order to secure a connection with other well-known roads, with which affiliation will be effected in making the shortest route by fifty miles between Minneapolis and St. Paul and Kansas City via Des Moines.

The indications now are that the company will take up the matter of extension, which has been delayed for several months, and that as soon as the route can be determined the contracts for construction will be let. President Ellsworth is giving the matter his undivided attention and is very enthusiastic in starting the work, with a view to getting the construction well under way as soon as possible this spring.


LAST SURVIVOR OF WAR 1812
