DRINKS ACID IN PARK

ST. PAUL GIRL TRIES SUICIDE AFTER AFTERNOON TETE-A-TETE WITH TWO MEN.

Maud Schabile, 20 years old, daughter of Fred Schabile, 13 Olive Street, St. Paul, attempted to commit suicide in Rice park, St. Paul, last evening and

would have died but for the quick work of Dr. Moore, the police surgeon. A. W. Hicks, living at the Metropolitan hotel, was passing thru the park when he saw the girl fall in the path. He summoned the police and she was taken to the city hospital, where it was learned that she had swallowed carbolic acid. She was unconscious until late last night, when she was aroused sufficiently to tell her name and address. She refused to say why she had attempted her life.

Persons who live near the park say she went there in the afternoon with a young man and that later an elderly man came and shoved the younger one off the seat. He then talked earnestly

to her and later he went away, leaving her alone. The police are investigating and think that a love affair is at the bottom of the trouble.

PAINTS BURNED FIERCELY

FIRE IN CRAMER'S PAINT AND WALLPAPER ESTABLISHMENT GIVES FIREMEN BUSY TIME.

Harry B. Cramer's large stock of paints and wallpaper, at 215 Sixth street S, was almost entirely destroyed by a fire which broke out in the rear of the building shortly after 9 o'clock last evening. The fire started on the second floor, in the rear, from an unknown cause,

and, fed by the inflammable oils and dry paper, spread rapidly, causing the firemen much difficulty in getting it under control. When the men first entered the building the rooms were filled with the smoke and gas from the oils, and some were nearly overcome while working. Mr. Cramer's stock was valued at \$4,000 and was only partly covered by insurance. The building is owned by the H. N. Leighton company and was damaged about \$500. A. W. Scott has a plumbing and gasfitting shop on the first floor, where there was some slight damage by water.
