SOCIETY OF COLONIAL WARS
ADDRESSED BY FAMOUS MEN

Lieutenant Governor of Massachusetts, Soldier and Journalist, and Eminent Chicago Pulpit Orator
Speak at Notable Fair Oaks Gathering.

East and west contributed last night to the program of the social court of the Society of Colonial Wars in Minnesota, held at Fair Oaks, the hospitable residence of General W. Washburn. The two addresses glowing with contagious patriotism and teemed with optimistic predictions for the glorious perpetuation in the American people of the Puritan character which made for good government. Curtis Guild, Jr., native of old Puritan Massachusetts, journalist, brigadier general of the militia, inspector general of the unifiers, politician, lieutenant governor, high in the esteem of the president, commanding of manner—delivered an eloquent, informal talk on "The Puritan's Contribution to America." Rev. Dr. Frank Gunsaulus of Chicago—native of Ohio, preacher, popular platform author, educator, head of Armour Institute of Technology, and of a practical temperament—gave a stirring address based on "Five Points of Americanism."

Both addresses were tinged deeply with religious spirit and pure patriotism, and deep concern in the signs of the times as affecting the American people in their internal government and their new world-wide influence. In his introductory remarks Judge Ell Torrance said: "This is an occasion of congratulation. Many things combine to make this a notable one in the history of the society. Tonight the door of hospitality opens wide and we find ourselves guests of one of our most honored members. We are favored by having with us two men of national fame who will address on subjects that we feel highly honored by their presence."

Mr. Guild, who is of Rooseveltian type, was extremely felicitous in his introduction of himself with a story of a memorable Dakota experience when on a tramp tour of the country with Theodore Roosevelt in the political campaign of 1900. His peroration was a bit of a word painting, sketching an incident of army life in the Spanish-American war, that gave a convincing touch to his declaration of the belief that the best spirit that the Puritan in his best hour had is the spirit of the Puritan that he recalled that the Puritan had not offered the only contribution to our history, and that from the beginning of our independence we had had the Puritan in many different guises. Prussia, Poland, France, Ireland, Scotland, the islands of the sea, had contributed to the roll of American patriots. In the seven men on the Hobson raft that went out to block Santiago harbor, five races were represented, all wearing the uniform of the United States navy. So in the settlement of the country north of the Puritan alone belongs the credit. Delving into history, he brought to mind the opprobrium that attached in literature to the term Puritan, showing that at heart the songs, all lyrics were on the side of the cavalier. The move of the Puritan was essentially a social uprising. It was against the form of society rather than against any particular religion at a time when a highwayman was lord chief justice of England.

Meaning of Puritan Uprising.
 The Puritan loved religion, because the Bible was the only bit of literature a self-respecting person could read. The Puritan had faced the condition of society and to it he struck the first smashing blow. He and his fellows came across the ocean to seek a place where they could govern themselves according to their own ideas. Those who followed themselves adventures went to the south to find a fortune. The stern middle-class came to New England to earn a fortune.

Mr. Guild mentioned some of the contributions of the Puritan: The New England town meeting; the constant habit of inspection; the Puritan conscience; free government; control of self. Ideals Not Lost.
 Coming to questions of the present day the speakers said: "I do not think we have lost the ideals of the Puritan. We had graft and corruption, but we have had graft and corruption before. We had graft and corruption in the time of Abraham Lincoln. Today public opinion is not satisfied with graft and corruption. Any man who takes a bribe, but it is seeking also for the man who gives the bribe. If we would avoid public ownership with political control, we would have private ownership with public control."
