

BOMB, HURLED AT 2 RULERS, MISSES

Anarchist's Bad Aim Saves Lives of President Loubet and King Alfonso.



KING ALFONSO, Spain's Boy Ruler, Imperiled by Anarchist Bomb in Paris.

Paris, June 1.—An attempt to assassinate King Alfonso was made at midnight. As his majesty drove with President Loubet from a gala performance at the Grand opera house a bomb, thrown by an anarchist, exploded with deadly effect near the royal carriage.

Excitement is intense. The police immediately rushed to ward him. At that moment a deafening explosion occurred. Cries from the crowd were heard and a scene of intense excitement began, the crowd surging to and fro.

The force of the explosion was terrific and caused a derangement of the electric lights, which were all extinguished, adding darkness to the scene of confusion.

Many other arrests were made. The first person taken was a man about 20 years of age. One of the crew was injured. It was not known whether his wound was caused by the explosion or by the violence of the crowd.

Through the night excited crowds remained outside the cordons of police and soldiers drawn about the scene of the explosion, and where officials of the municipal laboratory are searching for fragments of the bomb.

The Prisoners. At 2 o'clock this morning the prefect of police interrogated those arrested, who described themselves as follows: Louis Finot, 22 years old, a tailor; Marcel Hauten, 24 years old, a glass-blower; Ferdinand Boler, aged 21, a florist.

Caricature Is Removed. The Spanish embassy called the attention of the prefect of police to a huge caricature of King Alfonso exhibited yesterday on the Boulevard des Italiens.

Alfonso Reviews Troops. King Alfonso today continued to enjoy the festivities which France had prepared in his honor, apparently undisturbed by the attempt on his life.


Another Bomb Found. The suspects arrested immediately after the explosion were further interrogated today and the police announced that the main suspicion appeared to attach to a young man named Arsene Arnaud, who is held on the evidence of a woman who alleged that she noticed him lighting a supposed fuse.

Spanish Anarchists Arrested. Madrid, June 1.—An anarchist named Garnier has been arrested at Port Mahon and five other anarchists have been arrested at Barcelona.

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
