PRODS THE SWEDES FOR INDIFFERENCE

HELSINGBORG'S POSTEN SAYS SOME SHARP THINGS.

Declares That Norwegians Are Full of Fight While Swedes Are Trying to Placate Them, Regardless of Their Own Interests—Division Has Not Yet Come.

Helsingborg's Posten declares that the Swedes are too diffident and modest in the conflict now raging on the northern peninsula, and protests against the policy of continuously "turning the cheek to Norway for another slap."

"The Norwegians boycott every congress where they might run the risk of meeting a Swede, but the Swedes continue to invite the Norwegians to every congress, no matter of what character," says the Posten.

"In the May demonstration at Stockholm, one of the participating bodies had a banner with the motto 'Justice to Norway, Peace with Norway.' In other words they say that the Swedes are unjust toward the Norwegians notwithstanding that the latter had just declared that they would never again negotiate with the former. In the same demonstration was another banner with the inscription, 'Down with Sweden, Live Norway.' One can wonder what the consequence would have been had the 'Christiania' socialists shown a banner with the device, 'Down with Norway, Live Sweden.'"

"Our Swedish liberals, the most feckle and inconsistent in the world, scream as if possessed, when they suspect that they have not crawled recently before the dear Norwegian brethren. The latter on their part make, borrow and scrape together a fund of 70,000,000 kroner for a war fund against Sweden. Heretofore they have been preparing for war. A diffident people, the Swedes, who bear everything."

Norwegians Won't Retreat. The dissolution of the two kingdoms did not eventuate as rapidly as was anticipated. There seems to be no retreat in the Norwegian program, however, and the contest will be put through regardless of any other considerations. To all practical purposes the relations between the two countries are severed.

OBOLSKY IS POPULAR

But the Police Continue Their Outrages in Finland.

Prince Obolsky, governor general of Finland, understands the Finnish people much better than his own people, and is a personal favorite with the mass of the Finns for the reforms he has already instituted. Still much of the good feeling he personally inspires is counteracted by the brutality of the police.

Two Russian soldiers had killed several men, apparently for the sport of the adventure. More recently the home of a boarding house mistress was entered by masked men, who were equipped with duplicate keys. With no explanation whatever, they proceeded to bind and gag the woman, who was clad only in her nightgown, the hour being midnight. Thereupon they made a brutal search for incriminating matter, thru her rooms, emptying drawers, trunks, closets and cases, and leaving everything like so much rubbish in the middle of the floor. The poor woman was found next morning in a pitiable state, speechless with nervous exhaustion, sick with the pain of her plight.

The affair was, of course, instantly reported to the chief of police, who announced that he was in no degree responsible, nor did he know anything at all about the case. Every one is certain, however, that such outrages are the doing of the secret service police, and of nobody else.

KING OSCAR AND THE LAPP

How the Latter Got Justice at Stockholm After Long Journey.

Up in Norrland there once lived a Lapp who in some way incurred the enmity of his Swedish neighbors. His sole earthly possession was a small herd of reindeer. The hour being near, he decided to drive his herd, and among other indignities imposed upon him they killed his entire herd. The Swedish officers controlled the courts, and the Lapp was denied justice at their hands. It was dreary winter—never so cold and dreary anywhere else as in that far north country. The snow was deep. It was the "second watch" in the Scandinavian night. More than two months must pass before the sun would return from its summer home.

Securely fastening his "skidor" to his feet, the dejected Lapp sailed swiftly over the snow several hundred miles to Stockholm, the Swedish capital. He knew that he was poor and ignorant, but he was a Swedish subject, and as such would be safe to handle. He told his story. The king listened. His keen intuition detected the injustice that had been imposed upon the Lapp. He at once ordered a thorough investigation made, and the report verified the Lapp's complaint. The king compelled the slayers of the reindeer to make full restitution to the Lapp and punished the officers who had denied him justice.

Aalesund Becoming Stone.

Stone houses are springing up in Aalesund like mushrooms. In a year it is expected that the city will be rebuilt. The church will not be ready, however, as the authorities are unable to agree on the plans. The town is again on a fairly satisfactory footing.

New Explosive Found.

Gabriel Bjornereim of Nordjord, Norway, has discovered a new explosive which is as powerful as dynamite but cheaper and safer to handle. He has been offered 25,000 kroner for his patent rights. Bjornereim, while serving in Uncle Sam's army in Cuba was wounded in his leg and is living on a pension.

Prince Carl Buys Villa.

Prince Carl has recently purchased the so-called Bystrom villa, on Djurgarden, for 100,000 kroner. What his purpose is no one seems to know. He will naturally soon leave the prince's palace, but is supposed to have prepared for such a step by securing 1 Drottning street.

Big Collection for Children.

About 100,000 kroner was collected on children's day, May 12, in Copenhagen. The day was made a holiday, and everybody was out on the streets. Fine ladies begged from house to house, popular actresses and actors passed the contributions or handed false hand organs. The royal family gave freely to all deceptions.

New Mine Near Kongsberg.

Fiskum Mining syndicate has opened a mine at short distance from Kongsberg on the road to Drammen. About 100 men are employed under the direction of Engineer Otterbeck. The syndicate controls fifty claims on which have been found ore containing copper, lead and zinc.
