

New York, June 6.—For 980 shaves and seventy haircuts administered to Alfred T. Thurston, manager of the Astor house, Joseph E. Minady, the Astor house barber, recovered a judgment for \$161.50, which was today reversed by the supreme court.

Mr. Thurston declined to pay for various reasons, one of which was that, as he said, he had never paid for tonsorial services of any kind since he was a boy.

STATUE OF SELF GIVEN ROOSEVELT

MacMonnies Statuette of Rough Rider Is Presented to the De-lighted President.

Washington, June 6.—President Roosevelt was the recipient today of a beautiful equestrian statuette of himself as colonel of the "Rough Riders," which is the latest work of the eminent sculptor, MacMonnies.

The presentation was made at the White House by Miss Janet Scudder of New York, a pupil of MacMonnies, whose work has been accepted for the Luxembourg galleries at Paris.

The president expressed his unfeigned pleasure. "I now feel myself," said he laughing, "a great man. The distinction of 'being done' by either St. Gaudens or MacMonnies might flatter anybody. I had always hoped to see something in my position by MacMonnies, but it never occurred to me that I should have something by MacMonnies of me. The statuette is exactly as I should like to have it—the cavalry horse, the rough rider clothes and the emblematic support to the whole."

When attention was called to the inscription on the pedestal which supports the horse, "Virtute Vir," meaning a man of physical and moral force, the president expressed his pleasure.

DRAG RIVER FOR A BODY

MRS. J. L. GASLIN O FOHAMPLIN BELIEVED TO HAVE ENDED HER LIFE IN THE MISSISSIPPI

Anoka, Minn., June 6.—Mrs. J. L. Gaslin, a pioneer resident of Anoka county, left her home while temporarily insane this morning and is believed to have drowned herself in the Mississippi.

Mrs. and Mr. Gaslin have been living at Champlin, just over the line in Hennepin county, for a year. Mrs. Gaslin sustained a stroke of paralysis and had threatened to end her sufferings by drowning.

She arose this morning about 5 o'clock, but no one heard her leave the house. She left a note for her husband, upon which was written, "I've ended my life." Citizens are dragging the river for her remains.

A lightning bolt from the storm early this morning struck the residence of John G. Houston. The damage was slight.

DENNISON IS ACQUITTED

JURY FINDS HE WAS NOT INVOLVED WITH SHERCLIFFE IN POLLOCK DIAMOND ROBBERY.

Des Moines, Iowa, June 6.—Tom Dennison, the noted Omaha police king, on trial at Red Oak for complicity with Frank Shercliff in the theft of \$18,000 worth of diamonds from Charles Pollock, a Philadelphia diamond salesman, on a train near Missouri Valley, fourteen years ago, was acquitted late last night.

MOTHER AND DAUGHTER DEAD; POISON MYSTERY

Milwaukee, June 6.—Florence Belling, 21 years old, and her mother, Mrs. Anna Belling, are dead, presumably from drinking from the contents of a bottle supposed to contain brandy. The girl died several hours before her mother.

A no was found on the table beside the bed of Mrs. Meyer which reads: "Sell everything and give the dead a decent burial. In the purses \$29.56."

A search of the house by the assistant coroner failed to reveal any trace of poison. A further investigation is being made.

CONGER TO STAY AT POST

Ambassador Says He Is Not to Seek Gubernatorial Honors.

Mexico City, June 6.—Ambassador Conger puts an end to the rumor circulated in the American papers that he would remain here but six months, retiring to become a candidate for governor of Iowa. He says: "I have been repeatedly urged by my friends in Iowa to accept the nomination for governor of the state, but I have persistently declined to do so. My views in the matter have not changed. I like the diplomatic service and prefer to serve my country in it."
