CITY NEWS

PASTOR AFTER SALOON.

REV. J. B. THOREN SECURES WARRANTS FOR SEVERAL SOUTH SIDE LIQUOR RETAILERS.

Six South Minneapolis saloonkeepers whose places have for several years been objectionable to the residents, were arrested last night on warrants sworn out by the Rev. Benedictus J. Thoren, pastor of the Bethania Swedish Evangelical Lutheran church at Twenty-second avenue S and Twenty-fifth street. They are charged with keeping their saloons open on Sundays.

The men arrested are G. Anderson, who conducts a saloon at 2609-2610 Twenty-sixth avenue S; Adolph Anderson, 2613 East Twenty-fifth street; Charles Green, 2626 East Twenty-sixth street; Charles Brown, 2623 East Twenty-fifth street; John Linden, 2531 East Twenty-fifth street; and Charles Hanson, 2600 Twenty-seventh avenue S.

Shortly after D. P. Jones became mayor, the churches in South Minneapolis began the agitation to have the saloons closed on Sunday. It is purely a residence district, they say, and the saloons should not be allowed to keep open there contrary to law. Several delegations, including Mr. Thoren and his followers, called on the mayor, asking that the saloons in their district be closed on Sunday. Mayor Jones took no definite action, but told the visitors that he wanted to do just what the law was best for the interests of the whole city. He did not promise to close the saloons on Sunday.

The saloonkeepers, as well as many other persons living near the church, were surprised when they learned of the arrests last evening. There was some speculation as to the backer of the reform, but the general opinion is that Mr. Thoren is bearing all the responsibility. He refused to discuss the case before the hearing in court.

The six men were arraigned this forenoon. They pleaded not guilty and their cases were continued to June 14. Warrants for five more saloonkeepers in the same district are said to have been sworn out today.
