

GOVERNMENT SANATORIUM
Manitoba Sets Aside Lands and Funds
for Project at Holland.

Winnipeg, Man., June 7.—The Manitoba government has set apart 1,500 acres at Holland in southern Manitoba for the purpose of a sanatorium for

tuberculosis patients and \$100,000 will be spent on buildings, rural municipalities in the province agreeing to subscribe to the cost of the same with the government.

Beside the parent building there will be many cottages as well as the residences of physicians and nurses. Freedom from taxation in perpetuity will be granted. Dr. Pennefather, who is in

Winnipeg arranging the details, will be medical director.

MORE TROOPS FOR WEST

Regular Forces in Canada Will Be Greatly Increased.

Ottawa, Ont., June 7.—It is officially

announced that the regular force of troops will be greatly increased in the west, three squadrons of Royal Canadian Mounted Rifles (Redcoats), will be placed in Alberta and two in Saskatchewan. Batteries of regular artillery will be placed in Winnipeg and Calgary. Redcoated companies of infantry will also be stationed in Manitoba and Alberta. A regular regiment

of Strathcona horse will be established at Calgary and a military depot stationed at Regina. Some 2,500 men will be required to replace the imperial garrisons taken from Halifax and Esquimaux.


