BANKER INDICTED FOR WRONGDOING

FEDERAL JURY DESCRIBES 27 DIFFERENT FEATURES.

Thomas B. Clement Must Now Face Trial for Wrecking the First National Bank of Faribault—Aged Defendant Hears Voluminous Accusations Read in Court.

Thomas B. Clement, the aged president of the defunct First National bank of Faribault, faces twenty-seven different counts of wrongdoing which wrecked the institution, an indictment returned by the federal grand jury in St. Paul late yesterday afternoon.

The charge is made that the bank lost \$150,000, but according to the reports of the receiver the losses will be in excess of this amount.

The first count is a charge of embezzling \$1,000. The second tells of a false entry on the bank books listing a \$3,500 farm as an asset when, as a matter of fact, a contract of sale had been given on the farm and the purchaser's notes received.

The charge is that Clement abstracted securities amounting to \$68,245. Among these securities were drafts on the First National bank of Faribault, which had been deposited by the lumber company which had never been presented for payment.

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
