Mankato, Minn., June 27.—The celebration of the fifty anniversary of the founding of the St. Peter and Paul's Catholic church closed Monday afternoon with a grand Mass. Religious services were also held. On Sunday Bishop Cotter of Wisconsin conferred a class of two hundred children, of which thirty-five were from Mankato. In the evening a large party was given at the local Catholic organizations, with the Concordia band, the New Uta Catholic organization, with the second regiment band and the St. Peter Catholic organizations with the Mankato band. The Mankato children to be confirmed were also in the line.

Wintona, Wis., June 27.—Henry Cassidy killed John Stacey in a quarrel on the Omaha railroad near here yesterday. Both Cassidy and Stacey were working in an extra gang on the railroad, when they became involved in a quarrel. Cassidy picked up a pickax which he drove thru Stacey's skull. Stacey died a few hours later, while Cassidy took to the woods. Stacey was a quarterbred Indian and Cassidy was a Kentuckian, who came here a short time ago to work on the road. The sheriff of Sawyer county and a posse are searching the woods for the murderer, who is also looking for Cassidy and threatens to lynch him.

Superior, Wis., June 27.—The complete disappearance of Peter Lee of this city, leaving nothing behind him but a pool of blood on the kitchen floor of his home and a bloody half of a razor case, has given the police department a mystery which as yet has not been solved. Immediately upon investigation today Detective Osborne and the Superior bloodhounds on the scene and they traced the tracks of Lee or of some man who carried him to Tower Bay slip, where the scene ended. The police dragged the slip thoroughly, but found nothing to indicate that Lee had been thrown or had jumped into the bay. The facts in the case lead the police to believe that Lee probably was murdered in the kitchen of his home, and that his body was immediately hauled up to prevent the scattering of the blood from the wound, and that he was carried to a boat in the bay and subsequently thrown overboard in the bay. The man's friends and family connections are at a loss to find a motive for the murder or for the suicide theory which many advance.
