PARK REGION MEN IN ENCAMPMENT

A carnival of field sports for gold and silver medals attracted many contestants, and the electrical illuminations and fireworks' display in the evening will be a splendid feature. George H. Edgerston of St. Paul, a former resident of Kasson, delivered the address; a large chorus, composed of school children, sang patriotic songs. Professor Utrach read the Declaration of Independence.

CUMBERLAND, WIS.—The Fourth was appropriately observed by the biggest celebration ever held here. Professor W. T. Beam delivered the oration.

MILLS' RETURN EXCITES A CITY

Thought to have been robbed and murdered.

Sioux Falls Building Contractor Said to Be Dazed and Unable to Give an Intelligent Account of His Wanderings—Lost in Kansas City in April and Found in Portland, Ore.

Sioux Falls, S. D., July 4.—A genuine sensation has been caused by the sudden and unexpected return to his home in this city of F. D. Mills, a Sioux Falls contractor, who mysteriously disappeared in Kansas City last April under circumstances which led the authorities of the Missouri town to believe he had been robbed and murdered.

Relatives of Mills declare that he appears dazed and not able to give an intelligent account of his wanderings since his disappearance last April. In some quarters it is hinted that a temporary financial embarrassment caused Mills to leave in haste, and until his business affairs had been straightened out.

At the time of his disappearance Mills was on his way to a point in New Mexico for the purpose of closing the business in connection with the construction of some government Indian agency building, a local business man who had been associated with him in the government contract in New Mexico, learned that he was in Portland, Ore. He left for that city for the purpose of finding him, but before his arrival Mills had left for Sioux Falls.

LOSERS LEG UNDER CAR WHEELS
Accident to Christofferson, a Contractor, at Revillo.

REVILO, S. D.—In trying to board a freight train at this station, Mr. Christofferson of Waterbury lost his footing and was thrown under the wheels of the engine. He is in a hospital at Revillo.

Everything was done by the train crew to hurry the injured man to the hospital at Waterbury, all freight cars being held at this point and only the caboose being attached to the engine.

YOUNG MAN A SUICIDE

Decomposed Body of Young Bjornson Found in Northern Swamp.

EVELETH, MINN.—The decomposed body of August Bjornson was found in a swamp, a few miles from here by Ole Holmquist. Bjornson had been missing for a week and when his body was found was at first suspected, but a slightly rusted revolver was evidence that it was a case of suicide.

Bjornson was 22 or 23 and lived with his mother and mother-in-law.

No reason for the rash deed is known, as the mother is distracted and can give little information.
