Washington, July 11.—The state department is to be reorganized under Elihu Root, the new secretary of state. What Root did for the army the president hopes he will do for the state department. Not only will the personnel of the department be changed radically, but it is expected that entirely new methods will be put into effect, even down to the manner of transacting business and of keeping the files and records of the department.

FUNSTON'S FATHER NABBED FOR TALK

Too Inflammatory in His Utterances, the Ex-Congressman Is Arrested.

Iola, Kan., July 11.—E. H. Funston, ex-congressman and father of Brigadier General Fred Funston, was arrested here last night charged with inflammatory utterances. Mr. Funston, in talking of the explosion which blew up three saloons here, said the occurrence would have been avoided if the officers of the law had done their duty in enforcing the laws.

Funston resisted the policeman who attempted to arrest him and a fight resulted in which the policeman struck Funston, trampled him to his buggy and took him to jail.

Funston is a radical law enforcement man. His hearing was set for next Saturday.

PADRONE SYSTEM ON CANAL WORK

Coolies to Be Used by Commission to Solve Problem on the Isthmus.

Washington, July 11.—In order to speed the labor with which to build the isthmian waterway, the canal commission has been forced to adopt the padrone system and introduce coolies. The commission acknowledges its inability to secure the proper number of workmen thru its own efforts and in desperation has turned to the contractors, who will be asked to furnish 2,000 each of Japanese, Chinese and Italian laborers.

In explanation of the mixture of races, it is said that it is desired to experiment with different nationalities to determine which furnishes the best workers. It is stated that the representation from each class was fixed at 2,000 because that number can be carried on one ship.

For 500 Working Days. The laborers will be imported under contract to remain for 500 working days. In accordance with a decision by the attorney general, they will work only eight hours a day. The government will give them unfurnished quarters, fuel, water and medical attendance. The laborers who go to the isthmus will not be allowed to enter the United States unless they can comply with the immigration laws.

The employment of coolies is the last resort thru which the commission hopes to secure the men to dig the canal. It was at first decided to employ West Indian negroes, who are accustomed to the climate, and the commission opened an immigration office at Barbadoes on Jan. 1, thru which it expected to secure 5,000 men without any difficulty, but to great was the fear of the isthmian fever that not more than 1,000 West Indians were induced to go to Panama.

Bids for the coolies will be called for as soon as the commission has decided of the legal questions involved and arranged to protect the laborers from injustice and oppression. In his report to the president, published today, Joseph L. Bristow, special commissioner to investigate Panama traffic conditions, makes several important recommendations.

What He Recommends. Among these are the continuance of the railroad as a commercial line with improved facilities for handling commerce, including double tracking and re-equipping the line with modern rolling stock, the enlargement of its port facilities; the retention of the steamship line between New York and Colon; the cancellation of the contracts with the Pacific Mail steamship company and the South American lines, and the opening of the ports of Colon and Panama to all steamship lines on equal terms; and in certain contingencies the establishment by the railway of steamship lines between Colon and the gulf ports and Panama and important United States Pacific coast ports. It is also recommended that in traffic connections American steamship lines be favored as far as consistent with the treaty obligations of the United States.

Other Points Visited. Mr. Bristow spent several months in his investigation, visiting the isthmus of Panama, important ports on the western coast of Central America, the Isthmus of Tehuantepec, Mexico and the Pacific coast of the United States. His report reviews the entire history of the railroad and discusses allegations that its local freight and passenger charges were excessive and its traffic contracts with steamship lines monopolistic.
