GEN. DANA LED "THE OLD FIRST"

DEAD HERO WAS WELL KNOWN IN MINN.-SOTA.

Soldier Who Died Recently Served in Mexican and Indian Wars and Offered His Services to Governor Ramsey When the Civil War Broke Out—His Long Record.

General Napoleon J. T. Dana, who died suddenly of apoplexy at the home of Mrs. George H. Joy at Portsmouth, N. H., July 15, was well known in the twin cities. He was the oldest living graduate of West Point and was colonel in the civil war of our famous First Minnesota regiment, succeeding Colonel Alfred Sully.

Napoleon Jackson Tecumseh Dana was born at Fox Sullivan, Eastport, Me., April 15, 1822, the son of Nathaniel Giddings and Mary Ann Langdon Dana. His father died when Napoleon was a boy, and the lad was taken to his mother's home at Portsmouth, where he was educated in a private school till 1838, when he was admitted to West Point military academy. He was graduated and commissioned as second lieutenant in the Seventh United States cavalry, stationed at the several forts along the Gulf of Mexico. With this regiment he served through the war with Mexico.

At the desperate battle of Cerro Gordo, April 18, 1847, he received a wound supposed at the time to be mortal, and was left on the field thirty-six hours for the wound to be recovered. Later he was appointed in command of the Sixteenth army corps, department of Mississippi. At the close of the war he resigned to go to Alaska for commercial purposes. In 1872 he engaged in railroad work in 1888 he was appointed deputy commissioner of pensions at Washington. He was married in 1844 at St. Louis to Miss Sue Lewis Martin Sanford.

The child is the son of Mrs. J. Cooley, Mayhall flats. Mr. Cooley is an inmate of the Minnesota Soldiers' home. The mother says she placed the baby in Mrs. McCaskill's care because she was unable to attend it. Some of the neighbors say that the little one was neglected and starved.

NO LABOR PARADE

A Big Picnic May Be Held on Labor Day.

Labor Day is not to be observed this year with the usual parade by the local labor unions. Instead, there will probably be a mammoth labor picnic, attended by all the labor men of the city and their families. A labor speaker of national importance may be secured as the speaker of the day. John Mitchell will be given the first invitation.

The state fair management made a proposition to the labor committee of the Trades and Labor assembly to celebrate the day on the fair grounds. The offer was not accepted at the meeting Saturday night, and unless a more liberal offer can be secured, the picnic idea will be carried out.

A MYSTERIOUS FIRE

Ginter Grocery Company's Store Damaged by Flames.

Fire starting in the basement of the store occupied by the Ginter Grocery company on Sixth street damaged the building and contents to the extent of \$4,000 at 10 o'clock last night.

When the firemen arrived the entire basement was ablaze. The explosion and empty boxes made the fire difficult for the men to handle. There was a large stock of canned goods in the basement and this was practically destroyed. The stock on the first floor was also damaged. The loss is covered by insurance.

The origin of the fire is mysterious, like many others that have occurred this month, and the fire marshal will investigate.

NEW HOME FOR LOCAL MUSICIANS

BUILDING ON UPPER NICOLLET TO BE REMODELED.

Walls and Floors Are to Be Deadened So that Practicing Pupils Will Not Annoy Each Other—Northwestern Conservatory and Prominent Individual Instructors Secured as Tenants.

Musicians will have a home of their own in this city by next September, when the business block at 804-808 Nicollet avenue will be rebuilt for their comfort and convenience. As certain buildings are devoted particularly to the convenience of the medical profession, others to the use of lawyers, this block will be arranged so as to meet the requirements of musicians who desire to have studios down town.

C. Heintzemann, the well-known musician and band director, has closely dealt with the Minnesota Trust company for a long lease of the building. Plans have been made for the entire rearrangement of the interior, but the work will not be started until the fall. The principal feature of the improvement will be the deadening of the walls so that sounds will not penetrate and interfere with the work in adjoining studios. Mr. Heintzemann has been greatly encouraged in his efforts to provide a home for his professional brethren, and, also, in undertaking a large one, he has every hope of success.

A piano and organ house has already taken the entire ground floor, the Northwestern Conservatory of Music has secured the entire second floor, and several leading voice teachers have already engaged quarters, among them Willard Patten and Alfred R. Wiley.

GAINS ARE IN WEST

COUNTIES IN SOUTHERN SECTION MAKE INDIFFERENT SHOWING IN SECOND CENSUS BULLETIN.

Six counties in the southern Minnesota section, in the second bulletin of the state census bureau, increased a population since 1900 by 1,999, or 1.9 per cent. Three of the counties are in the second district, one in the third, and two in the seventh. The two second district counties, Lincoln and Yellow Medicine, show substantial gains, but Blue Earth and Le Sueur counties lost in population, and the other two counties gained little.
