RENEWED TALK OF BIG COAL STRIKE

United Mine Worker Chief Declares General Walkout Is Strong Possibility.

New York Sun Special Service. Pittsburgh, July 31.—Altho every effort is being made by officials of the miners' union to belittle the reports of a general strike, yet a statement by President Dolan of the United Mine Workers is proof positive that a general strike is expected.

"There is not the least doubt in my mind," said Mr. Dolan today, "that the coal operators of the Pittsburgh district will present a new wage scale on the 1st of January, when the present scale, under which the miners are working, will expire, and that it will call for a reduction of wages. If what I am led to surmise proves correct, there will be a general coal strike, just so sure as the reduction is demanded." The miners in the anthracite field have been working for the past two years without any agreement whatever, and are waiting for a chance to co-operate with the bituminous miners in a general strike.

The present troubles of the Pittsburgh Coal company leads President Dolan to the belief that a reduction of wages will positively be demanded.

President Dolan and National Vice President Lewis have at the present time a large number of organizers in the Irwin field, where there are 14,000 non-union miners. Every effort is being made to get these non-union men into line.

ITALY BUYING RAILWAYS

Chamber of Deputies Shows Majority for the Project. Rome, July 31.—After a four-days' special session for the discussion of the government railway bill providing funds for taking over the railways at a valuation with compensation for expenditure, the ministry of Signor Fortis received a vote of confidence Sunday in the chamber of deputies by a majority of 132. The chamber was prorogued until November, when the bill will be again taken up. The estimates provided for a payment to the railway companies of \$58,000,000 to settle the difference between the government and the three great companies.

All the other boys wish they were in it. The seven boys who belong to it get to the church an hour before Sunday school opens.

Theodore Roosevelt, Jr., not yet out of his teens has much of the earnestness and the vigor of his father, and he has entered Sunday-school work with the energy his father shows in his larger affairs. The Roosevelts have been members of Christ Episcopal church at Oyster Bay for years.

The class that Theodore teaches is a bright, healthy lot of youngsters. John Duffy, the eldest, is just 11 years old. His father is a gardener. Others are Willis Rogers, 10, whose father is a Lang Island railway conductor.
