

CHRISTENING OF THE KANSAS Governor Hoch's Daughter, as Sponsor, Will See Her First Bottle of Champagne.

The battleship Kansas will be christened Saturday, Aug. 13, by Miss Anna Hoch, youngest daughter of Governor Hoch of Kansas, and she will be christened with champagne. The W. C. T. U. of Kansas put up a stiff fight on this point as soon as it was learned that one of the five battleships provided for in the appropriation of 1903 was to be named for the sunflower state.

Resolutions were introduced in the Kansas legislature urging the use of water, but Governor Hoch was in favor of crude oil. "I don't mean Standard oil, or even independent oil," he said; "but just plain crude oil drawn from Kansas soil."
