MUCH NEW WORK GOING ON AT 'U'

THREE BUILDINGS MAY BE UNDER WAY THIS FALL.

None of Them Can Be Used During the Coming School Year, However, and Congestion Caused by Loss of the Old Main Will Be Worse than Ever, It Is Feared.

When the students of the university return to the campus this fall they will probably be able to recognize their alma mater, but that will be about all.

Ground has already been broken for the bacteriological laboratory, and its walls should be up by the opening of this school year.

The 'Old Main' will either be totally removed or else razed past recognition and it is even possible that the work on the foundations of the woman's building may be begun early this fall.

The anatomical laboratory, which was gutted by fire a few weeks ago, will still be in the course of repair, and work in some of the medical classes may be delayed in consequence.

Despite the fact that work so extensive as this is under way, conditions in the university will be as bad, or worse, than last year.

Not only are the classes suffering for want of room, but many university organizations are practically homeless.
