

Crusader Against St. Paul Gambler Loses Again.

Judge Lewis of the Ramsey county district court yesterday filed an order discharging the writ of alternative mandamus secured by Samuel Van Der-

sal to compel Sheriff Meisen to serve warrants against the alleged gamblers by Justice Gibbs. The court holds that the justice had no right, under the present Minnesota statutes, to issue the process. The decision is another defeat for Van Dersal, the former gambler, who is seeking revenge against his fellow knights of the green cloth.
