BEAT AND ROBBED HIM

LODGER'S ROOM RAIDED BY MEN WHO HAD ACCEPTED HIS HOSPITALITY.

Harry Durston, better known as Handsome Harry, is at the city hospital in a precarious condition as the result of an encounter with two marauders, who entered his room in the Minnesota house, First avenue S and First street, last night and beat and robbed him. Early in the evening Durston picked up an acquaintance with two men in the barroom and bought several rounds of drinks, showing them that he had money. The strangers tried to get Harry into a game of chance, but he refused and went to bed at 9 o'clock. The men waited in the barroom for a few minutes, then followed Durston who had gone to room 101. On his refusal to open the door, they broke it open, seized him by the throat and beat him to insensibility with a rock. They then went thru his pockets, taking \$20. Half an hour later the landlord was making his rounds and discovered the open door. He entered and found Durston lying unconscious in a pool of blood. The police were called and the injured man was taken to the city hospital. Later in the evening, Frank Cederberg, an ex-convict, was arrested by Detectives Lyon and Wirtensohn on suspicion of being implicated in the robbery. The bartender at the Minnesota house swore positively that he was drinking with Durston early in the evening. Cederberg was then taken to the city hospital, where Durston identified him as his assailant. Cederberg denied, but refused to give up the name of his pal. The police are now looking for the other man.

MAY RETURN MODEL

Reproduction of Viking Ship to Be Secured for Library.

After nearly three years at Eau Claire, Wis., the full-sized model of the historic viking ship of Gokstad is to be returned to its former place in the Minneapolis public library, if an agitation started by the Norwegian Society of America is successful. The model is of great value, being an exact reproduction of the viking ship unearthed at Gokstad, Norway, some twenty years ago. It was loaned three years ago to some persons in Eau Claire, to be used in a street parade, and has never been returned. Resolutions condemning those responsible for the loaning of the ship were adopted by the executive board of the Norwegian Society of America.


