To the Editor of the Journal. In your Wednesday's issue there were five letters on the subject of the Sunday saloon which proved interesting, and we think helpful reading.

Mr. Edgar complains that the first-class men who have held the mayor's office "will all testify that during their term of office they were harassed, nagged and worried by self-styled 'good' people, half-baked, irrational, inexperienced, theoretical and narrow-minded reformers, etc., etc."

The ease with which Mr. Edgar passes sentence upon all the people who do not agree with him does not make it perfectly clear to all of his readers that he is not a fair man.

It is just possible that he has a point also, and that he has felt its prick. This should be perfectly understood, at least, and this is a good time in which to have it expressed, namely, that if the so-called respectable class of men who prefer an open saloon on Sunday will not join those of us who believe that this intemperate institution should be made to pay some attention to the laws that regulate it, their call to have us join them again at election time will be in vain.

What is the demand of the Home Protective League? What is the demand of the people for the saloons in the day when they are asked to give up the saloon? Only this, that the worst institution in our midst shall pay some attention to the few and inadequate laws that have been enacted for its control.


