Mrs. Hoffman scored with great vigor that phase of modern Christianity that is supported by money "tainted" by the licensing of the liquor traffic.

### CHAUFFEURS ARE SLOW

BARELY FIFTY OUT OF THOUSANDS WHO RUN MACHINES HAVE ACQUIRED LICENSES.

More than fifty chauffeurs have been examined and granted licenses by the examining board. Only two women are legally permitted to operate automobiles thus far, these two being Mrs. Margaret P. Hubbard and Mrs. R. H. Holdridge.

Everyone who takes an auto on the street is obliged to have a license, and to secure a license such person must be examined and passed by the board of examiners, which meets on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of each week from 4 to 5 p.m.

Many people are not clear regarding the license, assuming that it is a sort of a local automobile license for the purpose of securing revenue. It is assumed that one license for each machine owned in the household or in the garage is sufficient. It should be understood that the license is for the chauffeurs and that every person who runs an auto on the public streets must have license, even if there are ten persons using the same machine.

While the authorities will allow a reasonable time in which to obtain license, the fact that only about 50 of the thousands of persons in the city who are driving or less chauffeurs have supplied themselves with licenses may prompt the authorities to expedite matters by taking in some of the people who are ignoring the law.
