# ROOSEVELT SURE OF A RATE LAW

He Is Confident Congress Will Confer New Powers on the Commerce Commission.

Journal Special Service. Washington, Oct. 6.—President Roosevelt is confident that the next congress will enact legislation increasing the powers of the interstate commerce commission and that he already has a majority of both houses with him on this important question. This was disclosed at the conference between the president and Representative Townsend, the author of the rate bill adopted by the house at the late session.

President's Plan. Mr. Roosevelt will recommend to congress that the commission be given authority to fix freight rates when it is found after investigation that existing rates are unreasonable. The rate as fixed by the commission will become effective after a reasonable time—about sixty days—and will remain in effect until upset by the courts. Mr. Townsend, at the suggestion of the president, will confer with Attorney General Moody in regard to the machinery necessary for carrying out the dicta of the commission, and as to whether appeals from decisions of the commission shall be made direct to the existing United States circuit courts when charged for transacting the increased business, or whether a court of transportation or some other tribunal shall be created to decide the appeals of the railroads.

Townsend to Draft Bill. It was agreed by the president that Representative Townsend should prepare a bill along the lines of the one he presented last session, but broader in scope. Immediately upon the convening of congress the measure will be placed in the hopper, and as soon as Speaker Cannon has appointed his committee the bill will be reported to the house and rushed thru. It will be known as an administration measure, and the president, in his message, will let congress know it.

Information has reached the president that the senate interstate commerce committee, several members of which are friendly to the railroads, will report a measure within ten days after congress meets. The president expects that he will be able to suit his views or adopt the Townsend bill.

Mr. Townsend says he has no doubt that the next congress will enact railroad-rate legislation.

## RURAL CARRIERS BUSY

97,701 Pieces of Mail Handled During Quarter Ending Sept. 30. The report of the rural free delivery routes which center in the Minneapolis postoffice shows that during the quarter ending Sept. 30, 97,701 pieces of mail were handled by the rural carriers. Of this total 87,194 pieces were delivered and 10,507 pieces collected. There were 155 applications for money orders.

Newspapers formed nearly one-half of the total number of pieces delivered, with letters and circulars ranking next.


