

FEW AMERICANS REALLY FAMOUS

Way to a Niche in the Hall of Fame Too Rocky for Most of Us.

Journal Special Service. New York, Oct. 10.—The second quinquennial correction of the vox populi began yesterday, and three Americans entered the hall of fame of New York university. James Russell Lowell scored at the top, William Tecumseh Sherman was second best and John Greenleaf Whittier scraped in along with them.

There was no occasion for anyone to feel proud of himself. Each needed fifty-one votes out of ninety-five to be famous. Lowell polled 58, Sherman 57 and Whittier pretty nearly stuck in the turnstile with 52. Poe, Cooper, Phillips Brooks, et al., did not arrive at all. Oliver Wendell Holmes lacked but three votes of being famous.

In 1900 the first attempt was made to find enough famous Americans for the hall of fame. It failed wretchedly. A committee of 100 public-spirited men, college professors, presidents, lawyers, editors, and the like, were to choose fifteen names by a majority vote as a starter. It appears that there were only twenty-nine genuine famous Americans at that date.

Few Men Famous. The electors appointed a committee to watch the obituary column, and adjourned for five years. This year the committee, which comprises the electors, over in the council room at Washington Square, failed still more wretchedly. The ballots for each nominee have been counted and only three great Americans have proved their worth to choose fifteen names by a majority vote as a starter. It appears that there were only twenty-nine genuine famous Americans at that date.

BRIGANDS SEND EAR TO HURRY RANSOM

Salonica, European Turkey, Oct. 10.—The British consulate at Monastir has received a package containing a human ear, which, a letter accompanying the package declares, was cut from an Englishman named Wills, recently employed by the Turkish tobacco revenue department. Wills was captured by brigands some months ago, and the letter threatens that he will be murdered unless a ransom of \$5,000 be paid by Oct. 14.

NORWAY ACCEPTS KARLSTAD TREATY

Storthing by Vote of 101 to 16 Adopts the Compact of Disunion.

Christiania, Oct. 10.—After two days spent in excited discussion, the storthing at 1:30 o'clock this morning proceeded to a division on the proposition of the majority to adopt the Karlstad agreement concerning the dissolution of the union between Norway and Sweden to a referendum. The proposal was rejected by a vote of 109 to 8. The agreement was then accepted by vote of 101 to 16. This is a signal victory for the government.

RUSSIA IS PENNED IN

Old Treaties of Dual People with France and Britain Hold. Stockholm, Oct. 10.—Count Wachtmeister, the minister for foreign affairs of Sweden, calls attention to the continued existence of the treaty of 1855, negotiated after the Crimean war, in which Great Britain and France engaged to furnish the king of Sweden and Norway with naval and military forces sufficient to co-operate with his forces in resisting the pretensions or aggressions of Russia. The treaty further binds the king not to cede any Swedish or Norwegian territory to Russia nor to grant her any coast privileges.
