Kansas Woman Declares Femininity Crucified by Modern Social Ambition.

Journal Special Service. Joliet, Ill., Oct. 19.—A little woman from Kansas took the platform at the convention of the state federation of women's clubs yesterday and painted a word picture of "the woman of today" that made 400 feminine faces flush.

When the little woman had retired she had projected, upon the mind of every mother and every daughter in the audience, an image of a woman with heart shrunk by lack of wholesome nourishment and with soul soiled by the stain of tainted money.

SOCIETY WOMAN SMUGGLER CAUGHT

Forced to Give Up Rich Jewels and Pay Added Penalty for Act.

portant than the primitively easy task of acquiring or keeping in order the old highway; so that there is properly no analogy whatever between the two cases.

Actual experience has shown that it is not possible to leave the railroads uncontrolled. Such system, or rather such a lack of system, is fertile in abuses of every kind, and puts a premium upon the most ruthless cunning in railroad management.

Laws Are Defective

"Experience has shown that the present laws are defective and need amendment. The effort to prohibit all restraint of competition, whether reasonable or unreasonable, is unwise.

Important Thing to Do

"But in my judgment, the most important thing to do is to give to this administrative body power to make its findings effective, and this can be done only by giving it power, when complaints have been considered by the body, which is to exercise supervision by the government."

Not Revolutionary

"This is not a revolutionary proposal on my part for I ever wished the same power given in reference to railroads that is now exercised as a matter of course by the national bank examiners as regards national banks."

Exercised with Wisdom

"It must be understood, as a matter of course, that if this power is granted it is to be exercised with wisdom and caution and self-restraint. The interstate commerce commission or other government official who failed to protect a railroad that was in the right against any clamor, no matter how violent, on the part of the public, would be guilty as a gross wrong as if he corruptly rendered an improper service to the railroad at the expense of the public."
