The patterns and the material are exactly the same as the \$40 and \$45 fellows give in their suits and overcoats, and if you care to compare samples, you'll prove it.



CLEVELAND TO HONOR MEMORY OF MORTON

Chicago, Oct. 20.—Former President Grover Cleveland, Mrs. Cleveland and a party composed of former members of Mr. Cleveland's cabinet, will arrive in Chicago next week en route to Nebraska City, Neb., as the guests of Joy Morton, where they go to attend the dedication and unveiling, on Oct. 28, of the bronze heroic statue in memory of J. Sterling Morton, secretary of agriculture during the second Cleveland administration.

Paul Morton, chairman of the board of the Equitable Life and former secretary of the navy, and several residents of this city, will accompany the party. With the possible exception of John G. Carlisle, all the living members of the second Cleveland cabinet will make the trip. As an additional compliment to the memory of the distinguished Nebraskan, the present secretary of agriculture, James Wilson, will attend the dedication.

RAYNOR SEES GORMAN TRICK IN MARYLAND

Baltimore, Oct. 20.—A tremendous sensation was caused in political circles by the appearance of a signed circular issued by Senator Isidor Raynor, and published as an advertisement covering a page in the newspapers. In it he denounces the proposed constitutional amendment to disfranchise the negroes, which is the sole plank in the democratic state platform. He declares that the amendment could be made to disfranchise 30,000 whites as well as the 18,000 blacks it is aimed against, and charges that its sole purpose is to enable Senator Gorman to retain control of the party machine.

He then makes a fierce attack on Senator Gorman without mentioning his name.


