THE WEATHER

The Predictions. Minnesota—Partly cloudy and colder tonight, with probably showers in eastern portion; Friday generally fair and colder, brisk northwest wind.

Weather Conditions. The low-pressure area over Saskatchewan yesterday morning has moved eastward to the region north of Lake Superior; it is in the Canadian northward to the Oregon coast, with rain during the past twenty-four hours near Lake Superior and in South Dakota and scattered snows in the lower Mississippi valley yesterday morning has moved eastward, and it is now off the south Atlantic coast, with rains during the past twenty-four hours from the Mississippi eastward and as far north as the Ohio. It is warmer than it was yesterday morning in the lake region, Minnesota, the Dakotas, Nebraska and Kansas, and the western part of the British possessions and in the north Pacific coast region. CHURCH GOERS IN GREAT MAJORITY

RELIGIOUS CENSUS SHOWS 70 PER CENT CHURCH PEOPLE.

Conservative Estimate Based on Returns of Canvassers by Religious Workers Indicates Pronounced Tendency Toward Religious Life—Largest Part of Non-Church Minority Confined to Confirmed "Tough" Districts.

Seventy per cent of the people of Minneapolis are church people. This fact has been established by a religious census of the city which was completed last night. The enumerators are making their reports to the committee in charge of the work, and by night S. M. Nichols, the secretary, expects to have complete returns from every ward.

Nearly all of the canvassers sent in their reports early today and from a hasty review of them Mr. Nichols was able to estimate the proportion of church-going people. Seventy per cent is a minimum figure and a more careful auditing of the census slips will undoubtedly will raise it considerably.

No pagan intellectual class has been revealed by this census. Almost without exception the better educated classes are church members or affiliated with some church organization. Probably 25 per cent of the 30 per cent of non-church people were found in the so-called "tough" districts. The enumerators encountered little difficulty in their work even in the slum districts. With few exceptions, people readily gave the information requested as soon as they understood the purpose of the census and will undoubtedly will raise it considerably.

KILLED BY ESCAPING GAS

GEORGE HENDERSON, FORMER MEMBER OF MINNEAPOLIS FIRE DEPARTMENT, IS ASPHYXIATED.

George Henderson, formerly a member of the Minneapolis fire department, was overcome by gas at the home of John Butler, 1005 Fifth street N, last night and died early this morning. Henderson has been farming for two years and was visiting his friends. He retired late last night and when children called him this morning there was no answer. Henderson was scarcely breathing then and he died before a doctor could arrive. He was slightly turned off in a hurry. The man was married and left the department two years ago after ten years' service. He had several children living—besides his brother, Fred Henderson, who lives in Minneapolis. Coroner Kistler decided that death was due to asphyxiation and allowed the relatives to take the remains.

PRICES ON LIGHT ARE DUE TO DROP

GENERAL ELECTRIC CO. CONSIDERING REDUCTION TO CITY.

This Is Attributed to Desire to Smooth Way for New Franchise Rather than to Any High Philanthropic Motives—Minnesota Power and Trolley Another Possible Factor.

Minneapolis will pay less for street lighting next year and it is possible that 1907 will be the year of reduction. Incidentally Minneapolis is due to see soon an electric light war that cannot fail to result in a saving of public money on street lighting.

The slight cut that will be offered by the General Electric company will not be entirely due to a change of heart if the general opinion of aldermen and other interested parties can be taken as accurate. The company is said to be paving the way for friendly negotiations over a new franchise. At the same time the General Electric company is furnishing arc lights on the same basis as the city's lights, and the new bid now up cuts the price to about \$50.

Kitchell's Company a Factor.

Another influence that is said to be back of the company's apparent change of heart is the Minnesota Power & Trolley company, which last winter secured an immense order for street lighting from the city. The ordinance offered arc lights for street lighting on the all-night and every-night schedule at not to exceed \$58.50. The old company and its friends insisted on restrictions for the new company.

New Capital at Elk River.

From Duluth comes the report that the Great Northern Power company, which is developing 150,000 horsepower in St. Louis county, or its affiliate, has taken hold of the Elk river proposition of the Minneapolis company. This will mean plenty of money to improve and develop the Elk River power. It may also mean that the Duluth company will decide to enter Minneapolis under the franchise of the Minnesota Power & Trolley.

He swore that his part of the game was to select the place for robbery, draw diagrams, turn them over to "Whitie," the leader who escaped, and then let the other members do the rest. CENSUS FIGURES FOR NATIVITY

LESS THAN A THIRD OF MINNEAPOLIS FOREIGN BORN

Nearly Half the People of the City Are Natives of Minnesota—Sweden, Norway, Germany and Canada Lead the Tables in the Order Named—German Leads in St. Paul. Nativity statistics for Minneapolis and St. Paul were given out today by the state census bureau. They show that in Minneapolis 115,987 persons are natives of Minnesota, and 68,321 were born elsewhere in the United States. There are 77,466 foreign born, or 29 1-3 per cent of the city's population. The foreign born are divided as follows: Sweden, 25,561; Hungary, 692; Norway, 14,963; Bohemia, 328; Germany, 9,074; Italy, 349; Canada, 7,803; Switzerland, 297; Ireland, 3,248; France, 299; Russia, 2,078; Wales, 292; England, 2,247; Greece, 110; Denmark, 1,871; Belgium, 105; Scotland, 979; Turkey, 25; Poland, 80; At sea, 48; Finland, 84.

WITNESS REFUSES TO ANSWER QUESTIONS

In spite of the combined efforts of attorneys and the court, and in defiance of a subpoena by the judge that she might be committed to jail for contempt, Miss Louise Fletcher, on the witness stand in Judge H. D. NEW SMOKE CRUSADE

Employing Corporation, Not the Fireman Is Made Defendant. Corporations and not their salaried employees are to be held responsible for the condition of smokestacks on large buildings hereafter. The first case of this kind was instituted today by the health department against the Northwest Telephone company. The warrant is issued against the company and not against the fireman as in the cases of former complaints. Taru it attorney the company pleaded not guilty and the case was continued.

SURGEON GENERALS TOO MANY, SAYS O'REILLY

Washington, Oct. 26.—Surgeon General O'Reilly, of the army, has prepared a statement showing there are three medical officers with the same title he holds, which has led to confusion which might become more serious in time of war. The title of surgeon general of the army was bestowed on the head of the medical department of the army in 1818. In 1871 the chief of the bureau of surgery and medicine of the navy was made surgeon general of the navy. In 1902 the supervising surgeon of the marine hospital service was made surgeon general of the marine hospital service. General O'Reilly says telegrams addressed to the "surgeon general" may be sent to anyone of these officers.

FREIGHT TRAIN WRECKED.
