

SORDID LIFE OF CRIME IS ENDED

Murderer of Women, at Bay, Kills His Consort and Then Himself.

San Francisco, Nov. 7.—Milton Frank Andrew and his consort, Petrie, who had fled after brutally attacking and robbing William Ellis, a horseman whom they had lured from Australia, were found dead last night in their room at James Meagher's house at 748 McAllister street.

Confessed His Crimes. A statement signed by Andrews was subsequently found in the stocking of the dead woman, in which he says: "The people of the United States have all read of Milton P. Andrews, the many-times murderer, and his terrible career of bloodshed. I am Andrews, and on Nov. 3 I offered to give myself up for trial on the thirty-four charges against me—the murder of Bessie Bouton at Colorado Springs, the murder of Mrs. Bosworth at New Britain, Conn., and the murder of the Troy, N. Y., woman, whatever her name is. The police claim to have abundance of proof that I killed all three."

Story of His Life. After a long and rambling story of his liaisons with the Bouton woman and others, and declarations of alibi to clear himself of the murder charges, he says: "After I am cleared of my trials I want the judge to arrange for me a divorce from my present wife, so I can marry Nulda. Nulda is to be entirely free of any charge in case I surrender and no charge is to be brought against her for what she has done in my description. The people who are hiding us are not to be prosecuted."

No property of importance was found in the room where the pair had been concealed and the bodies were evidently lived from hand to mouth and on the cheapest scale possible. There were evidences, too, that they were prepared for flight when the end came.

MRS. CHADWICK'S LAST HOPE FADES

Queen of Borrowers Gets No New Trial Except Thru High Court Appeal.

Cincinnati, Nov. 7.—Mrs. Cassio L. Chadwick has lost her last hope for a new trial unless the supreme court of the United States shall consent to allow city and county appeals to be refused her application for a new trial. Mrs. Chadwick is now in the jail at Cleveland under sentence to the Ohio penitentiary for two years, having been indicted and convicted of conspiring to defraud under the national banking law. The case was brought to the United States circuit court of appeals on a writ of error, sentence was suspended pending the decision of the appeal, and the hearing of the case was expedited by the court, being placed at the head of the October calendar.
