#### PROMOTION RULE FOR CONSULATES

President Issues Orders Intended to Increase Efficiency of Nation's Foreign Service.

Washington, Nov. 11.—With the double purpose of offering a permanent career in the diplomatic and consular service to competent young men and of improving those branches of the government service so as to make them more valuable than they now are to the business interests of the country, the president, at the instance of Secretary Root, has announced two new rules. The substance of the first of these is that hereafter any applicant for appointment as secretary of embassy or legation must possess a knowledge of at least one other language than English, and must be otherwise examined as to his competency. This rule is closely in line with the English practice, and in its development will involve the promotion of the bright young men in the diplomatic service in the degree that they justify it by hard study toward fitting themselves for new posts.

The order as to the consular service amends the existing rule, which requires the examination of such consular officers as are limited in compensation to the maximum of \$2,500 per annum and a minimum of \$1,000.

#### The Amended Rule.

The amended rule reads as follows: "It being of great importance that the consular officers of the United States shall possess the proper qualifications for their respective positions, to be ascertained either thru a satisfactory record or previous actual service under the department of state or thru an appropriate examination: "It is hereby ordered that any vacancy in a consulate general, consulate, commercial or consular agency now or hereafter existing the salary of which is not less than \$1,000 or the compensation of which, if derived from official fees, exclusive of notarial and other unofficial receipts, does not fall below \$1,000, shall be filled by a transfer or promotion from some other position under the department of state of a character tending to qualify the incumbent for the position to be filled; or by the appointment of a person not under the department of state but having previously served thereunder to its satisfaction in a capacity tending to qualify him for the position to be filled; or by the appointment of a person who, having furnished satisfactory evidence of character, responsibility and capacity, and being thereupon selected by the president for examination, is found upon such examination to be qualified for the position.

#### Secretary of State Controls.

"For the purposes of this order, notarial and unofficial fees shall not be regarded, but the compensation of an office shall be ascertained, if the office is salaried, by reference to the last preceding appropriation act, and if the office is not salaried, by reference to the returns of official fees for the last preceding fiscal year. "The examination hereinbefore provided for shall be by a board of three persons, designated by the secretary of state, who shall also prescribe the subjects to which such examinations shall relate and the general mode of conducting the same by the board. #### WIVES TRADED LIKE HORSES IN INDIANA

Indianapolis, Nov. 11.—"It's no use to me, we traded wives," said Jacob Cashman today, in court. Cashman, with Mrs. Mary Beckman, the woman he drew in the trade, appeared in court on complaint of Cashman's wife, Mania Cashman. Cashman was charged with wife-desertion and the woman with profanity. Mrs. Cashman is said to have been traded to Fred Beckman, husband of Mary Beckman. The court proceedings failed to disclose any evidence of a money consideration. It is said that things went along smoothly after the trade was made and the strange deal had every appearance of developing into something of a permanent nature. At length, however, the women met and hostilities began. The men met and hostilities were continued. The two men came to hot words and heavy blows. One thing led to another and thru jealousy, it is said, Mrs. Cashman caused the arrest of the husband who had traded her off and the woman who succeeded her in his affections. About ninety days ago Fred Beckman, one of the parties to the trade, was brought before Justice Stout charged with wife desertion. At that time he was fined.

#### GIVES UP COUNTRY RATHER THAN CHUM

New York, Nov. 11.—Peter Kohhaas, Youngstown, N. Y., with his "bunky," Joseph G. Cleveland of the same town, arrived here in the steamer of the Pretoria on Oct. 27. They had served together in the army. Kohhaas, who was born in Hamburg, is now 60 years old. In 1896 he enlisted in the United States army and was honorably discharged on Dec. 1, 1897, for disability. Two or three months ago the two men went to Hamburg to visit. When they got back Cleveland, being a citizen, was allowed to go. Kohhaas was taken to Ellis island. He has \$250, but only his first papers, declaring his intention of becoming an American citizen. In all the years he has lived in this country he had neglected to take out his second papers, but he has voted twice on his declaration papers. The surgeons on Ellis island noticed that Kohhaas was afflicted with a disease of old standing. He was ordered deported and will be sent home to Hamburg.
