

SEIZURE OF KOREA AS ACT OF PAGAN GREED

Chicago, Nov. 22.—Japan's practical seizure of Korea was denounced today as a "cowardly, dishonorable act of pagan greed," by Edgar Walton White of Denver, war correspondent for Collier's and the New York Herald during the war in Manchuria.

admire Japan for her valor or chivalry on the battlefield," said Mr. White, "or for her marvelous progress in the arts of peace, we now must admit that it is possible for her to do wrong. It is not yet two years since Japan signed a treaty with Korea guaranteeing the integrity and independence of the Korean empire and the peace and repose of the imperial house. This was signed Feb. 23, 1904, after the war with Russia started and when Japan was especially anxious for the good will of the world. She was applauded liberally for this act

in the American and European press. "Now that the treaty of Portsmouth is signed, Japan starts to Korea forthwith, and, with the use of bribes for those ministers who could be bought, and of bayonets for the emperor and the two ministers who could not be bought, she seizes the government and imprisons the emperor in his own palace." BELASCO'S NAME OVER ANOTHER MAN'S WORK

Journal Special Service. New York, Nov. 22.—In this month's number of Appleton's Booklovers' Magazine there is an article on "The Art of Acting" over which the name of David Belasco appears as that of the author. It takes up three pages and is a

valuable exposition of the principles of stage art. Almost the whole of it, line for line, word for word, was published thirty years ago in England in a book written by George Henry Lewes entitled "On Actors and the Art of Acting." In this, Belasco's most recent literary output, there appears to have been no effort to weave in his own work with that of another writer.
