NEW NAMES IN INSURANCE CASE

Morgan and Schwab May Be Called to Testify as to Odell's Deals.

Three-Cornered Dispute Between Odell, Hyde and Harriman to Be Aired.

New York, Nov. 23.—The three-cornered dispute between former Governor Odell, James H. Hyde and Edward H. Harriman regarding the exact facts of the settlement of Mr. Odell's shipbuilding suit by the payment of \$75,000 to him by the Mercantile Trust company, may be taken up again in the Armstrong investigating committee.

Long before the introduction of the Ambler bill, Governor Odell tried to recover his losses on his investment in shipbuilding securities. It is stated that he first went to George R. Sheldon, who headed the syndicate which took over the shipbuilding business of the Trust Company of the Republic.

Meeting with no encouragement, the next step he took, it is said, was to go to the offices of J. P. Morgan & Co. to get the head of that firm to bring pressure to bear upon the Sheldon syndicate.

It has always been thought in the financial district that on this visit Odell saw J. P. Morgan himself and presented the facts to him. When he was on the stand before the Armstrong committee, however, ex-Governor Odell testified that he never saw Mr. Morgan about his shipbuilding losses.

No result satisfactory to Odell came from these visits and the next matter was to present the matter to Charles M. Schwab and the latter's partner, Max Pam. These visits to Sheldon, Morgan & Co. and Schwab took place in the latter part of 1903 and the beginning of 1904.

Later on, in March, the Ambler bill was introduced, but it was not until August that Governor Odell decided to bring formal charges against the Mercantile Trust company.

BRYAN OFFENDED JAP WORSHIPPERS

SURPRISE SPRUNG IN BURTON TRIAL

Government Produces Witness Who Had Another Deal with the Senator.

St. Louis, Nov. 23.—The government sprang a surprise in the trial of United States congressman Burton of Kansas, charged with being the paid attorney for a corporation in matters pending before the postoffice department, by introducing as a witness today Charles H. Brooks, former president of the company which was the predecessor of the Rialto company and former president of the National Securities company.

Brooks testified that at a conference between Senator Burton, R. H. Kastor and himself, Senator Burton was introduced by Kastor, who said the senator was willing to represent the National company. Brooks said he did not see how the senator could be of any use to him.

There was some general discussion between myself and Senator Burton as to terms and other matters, but no definite arrangement was reached. The government also brought out the fact that Brooks is now awaiting a decision on the charge of conducting a scheme to defraud in connection with the National Securities company.

Another Witness. The government then asked permission from Judge Van Devanter to introduce additional witnesses upon his arrival in the city. Colonel Dyer announced that with this exception the prosecution had completed its case.



WOMAN DUPE OF 'KING SOLOMON'

Notorious Black Clairvoyant, Formerly of Minneapolis, Wanted in Chicago.

Accused of Hypnotizing and Kidnapping a Woman for Her Wealth.

Chicago, Nov. 23.—By the use of hypnotic powers, King Solomon, a negro clairvoyant, formerly of Minneapolis, is alleged to have practically kidnapped Mrs. Jennie H. Doolittle, 60 years old, and to have taken her to New York, where she is spending her \$20,000 estate for the support of his mediumistic enterprises.

Her daughters, Dr. Adelaide D. Hoefel, 22, and Mrs. F. Hoefel, 23, filed a petition in the superior court yesterday to restrain their mother from disposing of her Illinois property, and asking for a receiver. The probate court was also asked to appoint a conservator for Mrs. Doolittle on grounds that she is of unsound mind, and that the influence of the clairvoyant and charlatans, who are alleged to be her confidants, is such that she is unable to manage her affairs.

Widow from Wisconsin. Mrs. Doolittle is the widow of Ira E. Doolittle of Walworth county, Wisconsin, who died in 1901. She has a wife and an estate in Wisconsin and Chicago valued at \$20,000.

Despite the efforts of her children to break the spell, it is said that Mrs. Doolittle had become infatuated with King Solomon, and had given him money to carry on his business. Mrs. Doolittle is said to have been induced by King Solomon to furnish the house at 1242 Michigan avenue for him, and is said to have advanced large sums of money.

Under Control by Fakirs. This petition was signed by David Crighton, a friend of Mrs. Doolittle. The petition also asks for the appointment of a conservator for Mrs. Doolittle, alleging that she is under control and influence of certain fakirs and charlatans who are endeavoring to dissipate her estate.
