GIRL LEAPS FROM BRIDGE TO DEATH

Religion Causes Miss Myrtle Cory of Medford to Commit Suicide at Winona.

Winona, Minn., Nov. 27.—Miss Myrtle Cory, a student in the elementary course at the normal school, 23 years of age, walked to the middle of the wagon bridge across Lake Winona at the church hour yesterday morning and jumped into the water.

Prior to jumping she took off her jacket and fur, and the pockets of the jacket she left a note addressed to her father, mother, brothers and sisters, asking them to forgive her for the act, saying it was caused by religion. Her home was at Medford, Steele county. She graduated from the high school in Owatonna in 1905, and for five years taught in the schools at Medford, coming to Winona this fall for a normal course.

She had been ailing for a few days and had consulted a physician, but she had been out of school only half a day. The body has been recovered, and the father is on the way here to take it home.

GOVERNMENT ACTS IN ALLEGED LAND FRAUDS

Hunt in the United States court has, upon the petition of District Attorney Rasch, made an order directing certain persons to be made defendant in the suits of the government against Frederick A. Hyde and others, to appear and plead Feb. 5 next.

This is the suit instituted by District Attorney Rasch at the request of Attorney General Moody, by which the government seeks to restore to the public domain about 4,000 acres, covered by twenty-five patents, on the ground that the scrip under which it was taken over was secured in a fraudulent manner by the California land operators.
